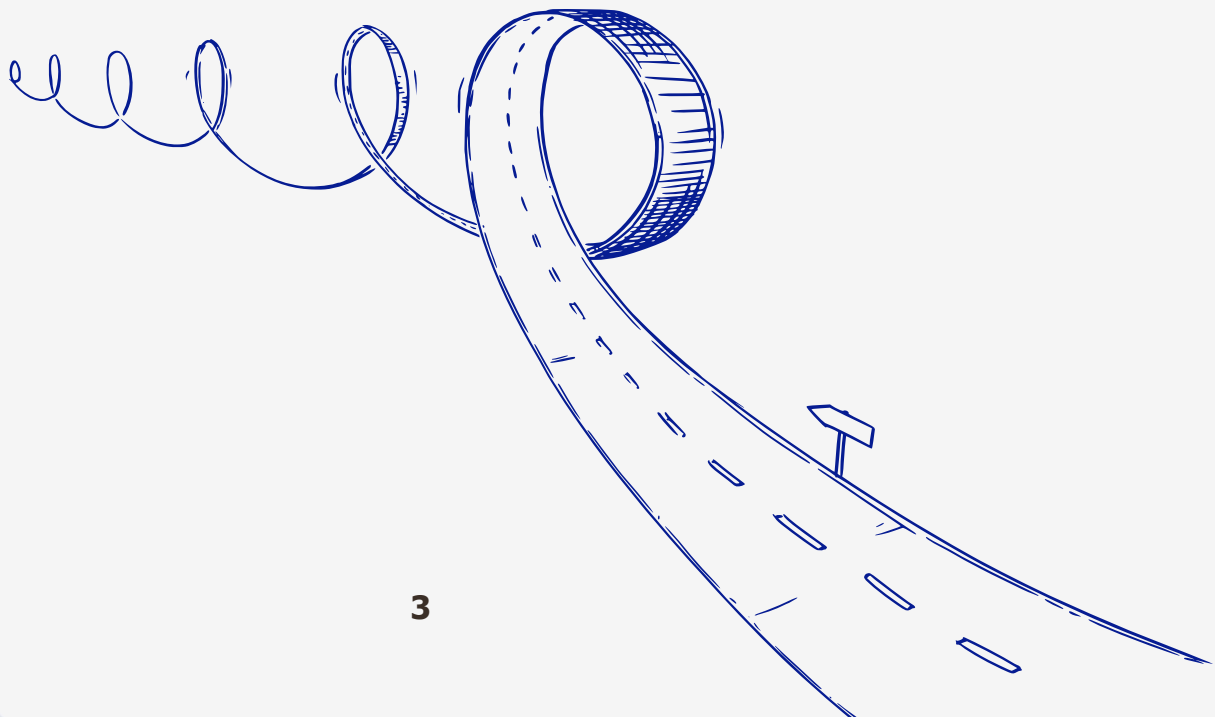



From Fiumicino Airport...

... to **CAMPIDOGLIO**, the **THEATRE OF MARCELLUS** and **TIBER ISLAND**


Reaching the heart of Rome from Fiumicino Airport is the first step toward discovering the rich, centuries-old heritage of the Eternal City. This guide provides clear, practical, and up-to-date information on how to reach the Capitoline Hill (Campidoglio), the Theatre of Marcellus, and Tiber Island in a way that is safe, accessible, and suitable for all visitors.

There are several ways to make this journey, each offering different advantages in terms of travel time, comfort, and accessibility.






Option 1: Travel to Roma Termini, the city’s main railway hub, then continue toward Campidoglio, the Theatre of Marcellus, and Tiber Island using buses or other accessible services.

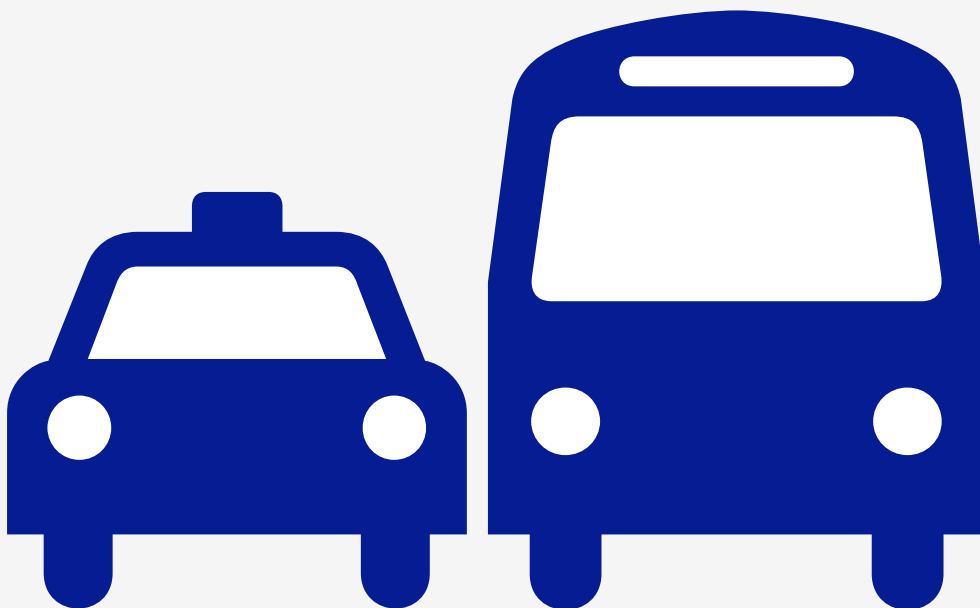


Option 2: Use direct connections such as private transfers, accessible taxis, or dedicated shuttle services—ideal for those who prefer, or require, minimal transfers.

Note: The number of accessible vehicles is limited, so advance booking is strongly recommended.



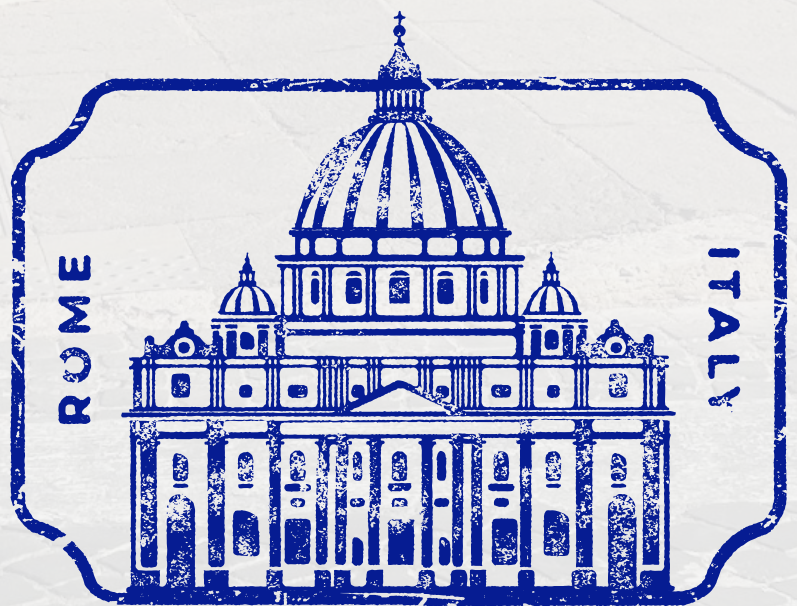
Option 3: Care to Fly service for passengers with reduced mobility.



This guide will help you choose the most suitable route based on your needs, providing detailed information on:

- Transport accessibility
- Assistance services available at the airport and stations
- Architectural barriers along the route
- Travel times and recommended options for passengers with disabilities

Whatever option you choose, the goal remains the same: to reach **Campidoglio**, the **Theatre of Marcellus**, and **Tiber Island** comfortably, safely, and with ease—so you can begin your visit to Rome in the best possible way.



OPTION 1: LEONARDO EXPRESS TRAIN + BUS

Leonardo Express Train

The **Leonardo Express train** can be reached from Fiumicino Airport by following the clearly marked route connecting Terminals 1 and 3 directly to the airport railway station. The pedestrian route from the terminals to the station is fully accessible, featuring wide corridors, elevators, extended moving walkways, and LOGES tactile paths to overcome level differences. Ramps with handrails on both sides and clear visual signage are also available.

Fiumicino Airport railway station is equipped with accessible ticket gates, accessible ticket machines, step-free platforms, and both visual and audio announcements.

The Leonardo Express is a direct train to **Roma Termini**, with no intermediate stops. The journey takes **approximately 32 minutes**, typically arriving at platform 24.

The train is fully accessible to wheelchair users, with reserved seating areas and accessible restrooms. Both visual and audio announcements are provided.

Assistance services are available at both Fiumicino Airport station and Roma Termini.

Guide dogs travel free of charge, and small pets are allowed in carriers.

From **Roma Termini Station**, proceed to the **Piazza dei Cinquecento exit**, where the bus stops are located.

Roma Termini Station is equipped with clear signage, full LOGES tactile paving, a tactile map, and both visual and audio guidance systems.

Movement between different station levels is possible by:

- **Using the station stairlift with your wheelchair**
- **Using moving walkways, accessible turnstiles, and elevators**

Note: Handrails are not available in some station corridors.

To reach Campidoglio, take **bus line H (Termini – Dei Capasso)**, or alternatively **line 170 (Termini – Agricoltura)**.

- The route to the bus stops is direct and easy to follow, with clear signage, smooth flooring, and step-free access.
- Both lines operate accessible buses equipped with manually operated ramps and designated spaces for wheelchairs.
- The journey to the **Ara Coeli / Piazza Venezia stop** takes **approximately 25 minutes**.
- Buses are equipped with audio announcements and stop displays.



Walking route to Campidoglio

- From the **Ara Coeli / Piazza Venezia stop**, head toward the fountain in **Piazza d'Aracoeli** and follow a flat route to the crossing on **Via di San Venanzio**, which is not traffic-light controlled but marked with pedestrian crossings.
- After crossing, continue along continuous sidewalks without steps, with ramps available to reach the pedestrian area of **Via del Teatro di Marcello**.
- At the base of the Capitoline Hill, the space narrows as you enter **Via delle Tre Pile**, an uphill street leading to **Piazza del Campidoglio**. The route is continuous but features cobblestone paving and a steady incline.
- The route is step-free and equipped with ramps; however, there are crossings without traffic lights, narrow sections, and stretches with slopes and cobblestones.



Panoramic viewpoint over the Roman Forum

- From **Piazza del Campidoglio**, cross the central space. Entry and exit points are marked by bollards connected by chains, with side passages wide enough for wheelchairs.
- After **about 30 meters**, you reach the panoramic viewpoint: an open, level area that allows easy access to the parapet.
- The route is step-free and provides an accessible viewpoint, though there are no tactile safety features or dedicated signage.



Walking route to the Theatre of Marcellus

- From **Piazza del Campidoglio**, take **Via delle Tre Pile downhill**. The route is continuous and step-free but features cobblestones, a steady slope, and some curves.
- At the intersection with **Via del Teatro di Marcello**, turn left and continue for **about 150 meters**. The route is flat and leads to a crossing with a ramp but no traffic light.
- Turn right to reach the entrance of the Theatre.

Walking route to Tiber Island

- The archaeological area includes a cobbled ramp leading to **Largo 16 Ottobre 1943**, from where you can continue toward **Via del Portico d'Ottavia**.
- Proceed along a short stretch of roadway with cobblestones shared with parked vehicles.
- Continue to the pedestrian crossing at **Piazza Gerusalemme**. The crossing is traffic-light controlled and equipped with a suitable ramp.
- Proceed toward **Lungotevere dei Pierleoni** and continue to **Ponte Fabricio**. The bridge is accessible but features cobblestones and two fixed barriers that narrow the passage.
- Take **Via di Ponte Quattro Capi** to reach **Piazza San Bartolomeo all'Isola**.

OPTION 2: TAXI

Taxi services are available outside the Arrivals areas of Terminals 1 and 3 and can take you directly to your destination.

Fares are set by the Municipality of Rome and the Municipality of Fiumicino and may change without prior notice. It is advisable to check the official website romamobilita.it for updates.

Licensed taxis are easily identifiable: white vehicles with a "TAXI" sign on the roof and a visible license number on the doors, rear, and inside the vehicle.

Note: Not all taxis are accessible. To ensure availability, it is recommended to book in advance and request a specially equipped vehicle.

For some destinations, a **fixed fare** is applied, which includes all surcharges. You can download the **updated price list** directly online.

Fixed Taxi Fares from/to Fiumicino Airport

For some destinations, **fixed fares** apply, which include any additional charges:

- **Rome city center (within the Aurelian Walls): € 55.00**
- **Tiburtina Station: € 60.00**
- **Ostiense Station: € 50.00**

Journeys starting or ending within the **Grande Raccordo Anulare** and traveling to or from the airport must not exceed **€ 80.00**.

For all other destinations not covered by **fixed fares**, a **minimum fare of € 35.00** applies.

- Advance booking is recommended, specifying the need for a vehicle equipped with a ramp and space for a wheelchair.
- The standard fixed fare for official taxis is **€ 55.00** for the route from Fiumicino to central Rome (including the Colosseum), although additional charges may apply for specially equipped vehicles.

OPTION 3: CARE TO FLY

Care to Fly is a door-to-door transfer service designed for passengers with reduced mobility when traveling to or from **Fiumicino** and **Ciampino** airports. The service is provided in collaboration with **ADR Assistance**, which offers free support within airport areas.

Vehicles are specially equipped to meet the specific needs of each traveler, ensuring a safe and comfortable transfer.

Passengers are assisted directly from their aircraft seat and accompanied to the vehicle that will take them to their destination.

Accessibility at Piazza del Campidoglio:

- The access route is continuous and step-free.
- Ramps are available at key crossing points.
- The square is largely accessible by wheelchair, with open and navigable spaces.
- The panoramic viewpoint over the Roman Forum is barrier-free.

Note: Cobblestone paving and the constant incline of access routes may be challenging for some users.



Tickets and Access:

Access to Piazza del Campidoglio and the panoramic viewpoint is free.



Accessibility at the Theatre of Marcellus (external area):

- The Theatre of Marcellus is an open-air monument, accessible without physical barriers.
- External routes are step-free and allow close access to the monument.
- Ramps are available at main crossings.

Note: Some surfaces are uneven, and temporary obstacles (bicycles, crowds, bus stops) may be present. Some crossings are not traffic-light controlled.

Tickets and Access:

The external area of the Theatre of Marcellus is freely accessible.

Visits to interior spaces or special events may require a ticket.





Accessibility at Tiber Island – San Bartolomeo

- Tiber Island can be reached **via Ponte Fabricio**, which is accessible by wheelchair.
- The route is continuous and step-free, with ramps at key points.
- **Piazza San Bartolomeo** is accessible and allows for stopping and maneuvering.

Note: Cobblestones, narrowing due to barriers and chains, and irregularly parked vehicles may temporarily reduce available space.



Tickets and Access:

Access to Tiber Island and Piazza San Bartolomeo is free.

The Basilica of San Bartolomeo all'Isola is free to enter, subject to opening hours and religious services.
