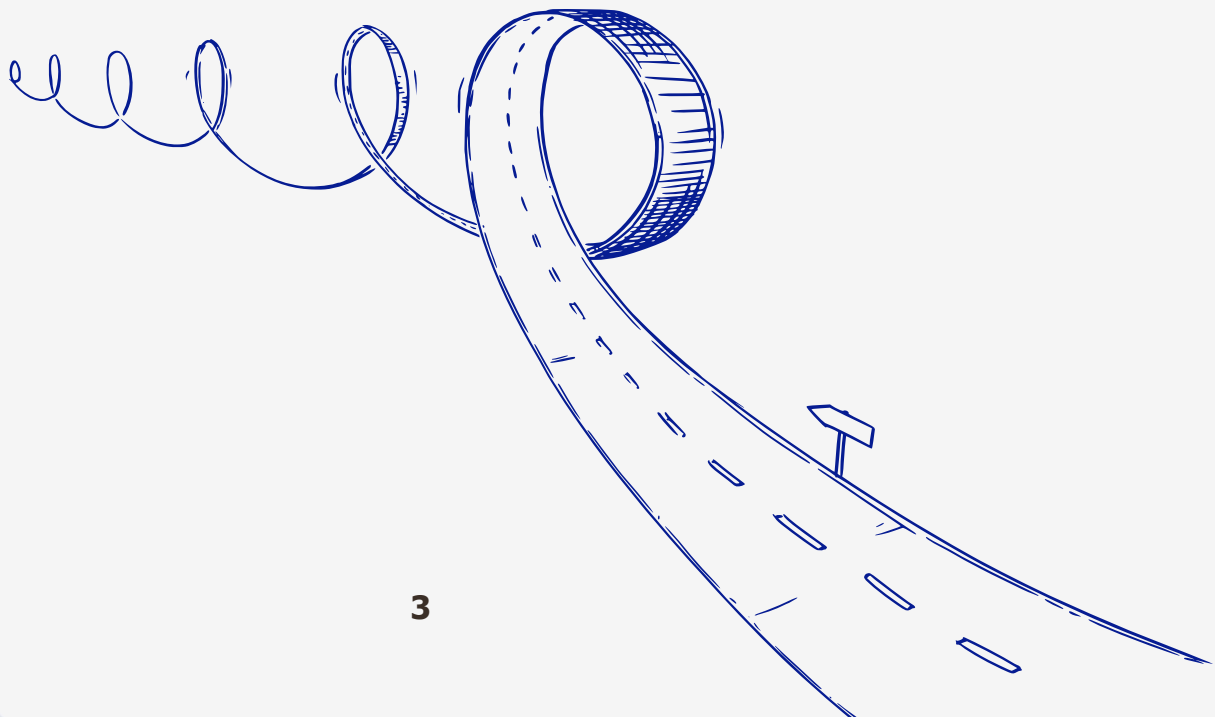



From Fiumicino Airport...

... to the COLOSSEUM and the ROMAN FORUM


Reaching the heart of Rome from Leonardo da Vinci International Airport (Fiumicino) is the first step toward immersing yourself in the millennia-old history of the Eternal City. This guide is designed to provide clear, practical, and up-to-date information on how to reach the Colosseum and the Roman Forum, located within one of the oldest archaeological parks in the world, in an accessible and safe way for everyone.

There are several valid options for completing this journey, each with different characteristics in terms of time, comfort, and accessibility.






Option 1: Connection to Roma Termini Station by fast train, the city's main railway hub, from which it is possible to easily continue toward the site by bus, metro, or other accessible services.

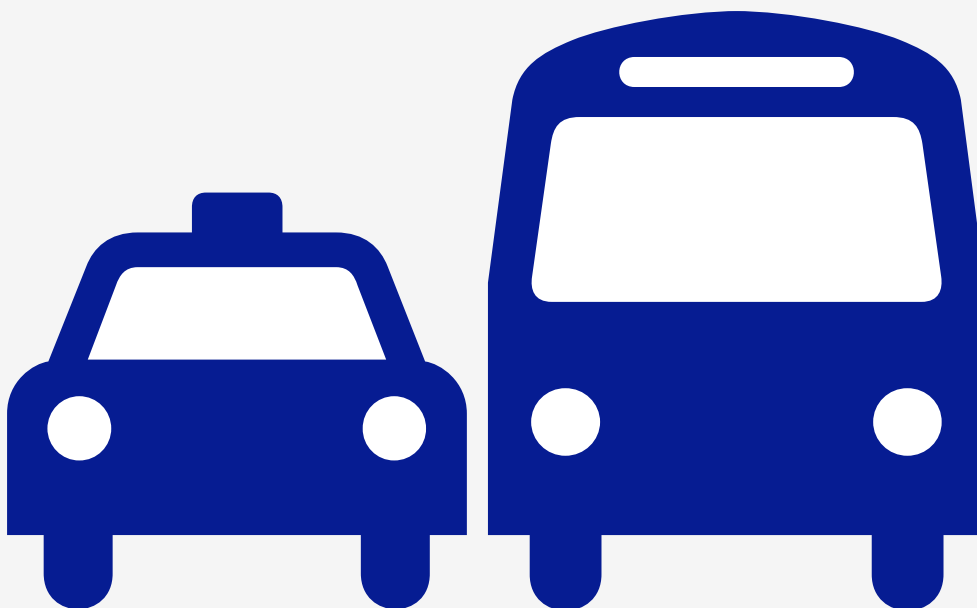


Option 2: Direct connection via private services, accessible taxis, or dedicated shuttle services, ideal for those who wish or need to minimize transfers.

Note: The number of accessible vehicles is limited, therefore advance booking is recommended.



Option 3: Care to Fly service for people with reduced mobility.



Colosseo

This guide helps you choose the route best suited to your needs, with detailed information on:

- Accessibility of transport services
- Assistance services available at the airport and in stations
- Architectural barriers along the route
- Travel times and recommended solutions for travelers with disabilities

Whatever means of transport you choose, the goal is one: to reach the **Colosseum** and the **Roman Forum** easily, safely, and accessibly, to begin your visit to the Eternal City in the best possible way.



OPTION 1: FAST TRAIN + METRO LINE B

Leonardo Express Train

You can reach the **Leonardo Express train** from Fiumicino by following the marked route connecting the terminals directly to **Fiumicino Airport railway station**, accessible via moving walkways and elevators. The pedestrian route from the terminals to the station is fully accessible, with wide corridors, extended moving walkways, and LOGES tactile paths to overcome level differences, as well as ramps equipped with handrails on both sides.

Direct train to **Roma Termini**, with no intermediate stops; in **32 minutes** you reach **Roma Termini Station**, usually at **platform 24**.

Fully accessible for wheelchairs: it is equipped with reserved seating, accessible restrooms, doors, and visual display systems. Both audio and visual announcements are available.

Assistance services are present in the station (elevators, ramps) both at Fiumicino and Termini.

Guide dogs travel free of charge, and the train also accommodates other animals in carriers.

Metro Line B

From **Roma Termini Station**, you can take **Metro Line B** toward "**Laurentina**" and get off at the "**Colosseo**" stop.

Roma Termini Station is equipped with clear signage, full LOGES tactile paths, a tactile map, and both visual and audio information.

You can move between the different levels of the station by:

- **Using the station stairlift with your wheelchair**
- **Using moving walkways, accessible turnstiles, and elevators**

Note: Handrails are absent in some station corridors.

Colosseo station is partially accessible: the main routes are equipped with stairlifts, handrails, and a dedicated gate for wheelchairs or powered mobility aids. The flooring is even and continuous.

From the station ramp, it is possible to proceed toward the Colosseum, which is located directly in front of the metro exit; the route is flat and sidewalks are equipped with curb ramps. Access to the ticket office is along Via dei Verbiti sidewalk, where a small ramp is present.

Note: Elevators, moving walkways, and escalators are not available; tactile maps are absent, and LOGES paths are only partial within the station.

To continue toward the entrance of the Roman Forum, proceed along the sidewalk of **Via dei Fori Imperiali** up to the intersection with **Via in Miranda**. The route includes ramps and tactile signage.

The most accessible entrance is located at the intersection with **Largo della Salara Vecchia**, on the right side of the gate. The entrance is equipped with a descending ramp and an elevator.

OPTION 2: TAXI

Taxi service is available at the Arrivals areas of Terminals 1 and 3 and can take you directly to your destination.

Fares, set by the Municipality of Rome and the Municipality of Fiumicino, may change without notice. It is recommended to check romamobilita.it for updates.

Authorized taxis are white vehicles with a "TAXI" sign on the roof and a visible license number.

Note: Not all taxis are accessible. It is recommended to book in advance specifying the need for an equipped vehicle.

For some destinations, a fixed fare is applied, which includes all surcharges.

Fixed Taxi Fares to/from Fiumicino Airport

For some destinations, **fixed fares** apply, which include any additional charges:

- **Rome city center (within the Aurelian Walls): € 55.00**
- **Tiburtina Station: € 60.00**
- **Ostiense Station: € 50.00**

Journeys starting or ending within the **Grande Raccordo Anulare** and traveling to or from the airport must not exceed **€ 80.00**.

For all other destinations, a **minimum fare of € 35.00** applies.

- Advance booking is recommended requesting a vehicle with a ramp and wheelchair space.
- **Fixed fare** for official taxis: **€ 55.00** from Fiumicino Airport to Rome city center, with possible supplements for special vehicles.

OPTION 3: CARE TO FLY

Care to Fly is a door-to-door transfer service designed for passengers with reduced mobility when traveling to or from **Fiumicino** and **Ciampino** airports. The service is offered in collaboration with **ADR Assistance**.

Vehicles are equipped to meet specific needs, ensuring safe and comfortable transfers.

You will be welcomed directly at your seat on the aircraft and accompanied to your vehicle.

Accessibility at the Colosseum:

- Visitors already in possession of a ticket can proceed to the left from Colosseo metro station.
- The accessible entrance is the side entrance, near the group and underground entrance, equipped with a metal ramp and smoother flooring compared to other entrances.
- The Colosseum is equipped with elevators connecting all levels.
- Assistance staff is available and, upon request, a wheelchair can be provided for the visit.

Note: The Colosseum features uneven flooring and historical level differences.



Accessibility at the Roman Forum:

Accessible entrances:

- **Via della Salara Vecchia:** equipped with a ramp and elevator for access to the lower level of the Forum.



Tickets and Access

- **Free entry** to the Colosseum and the Roman Forum is available for **visitors with disabilities** and one accompanying person, with mandatory online booking.
- You must present documentation certifying eligibility for free admission at the entrance.
