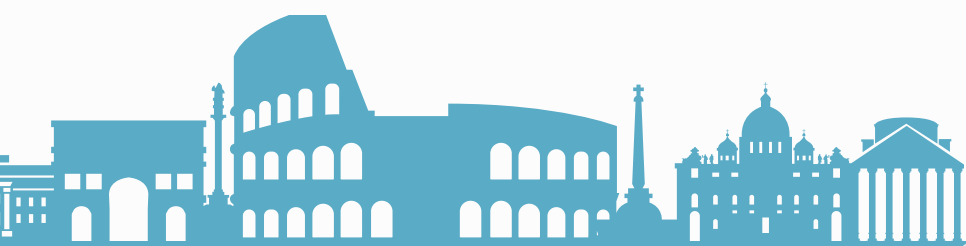

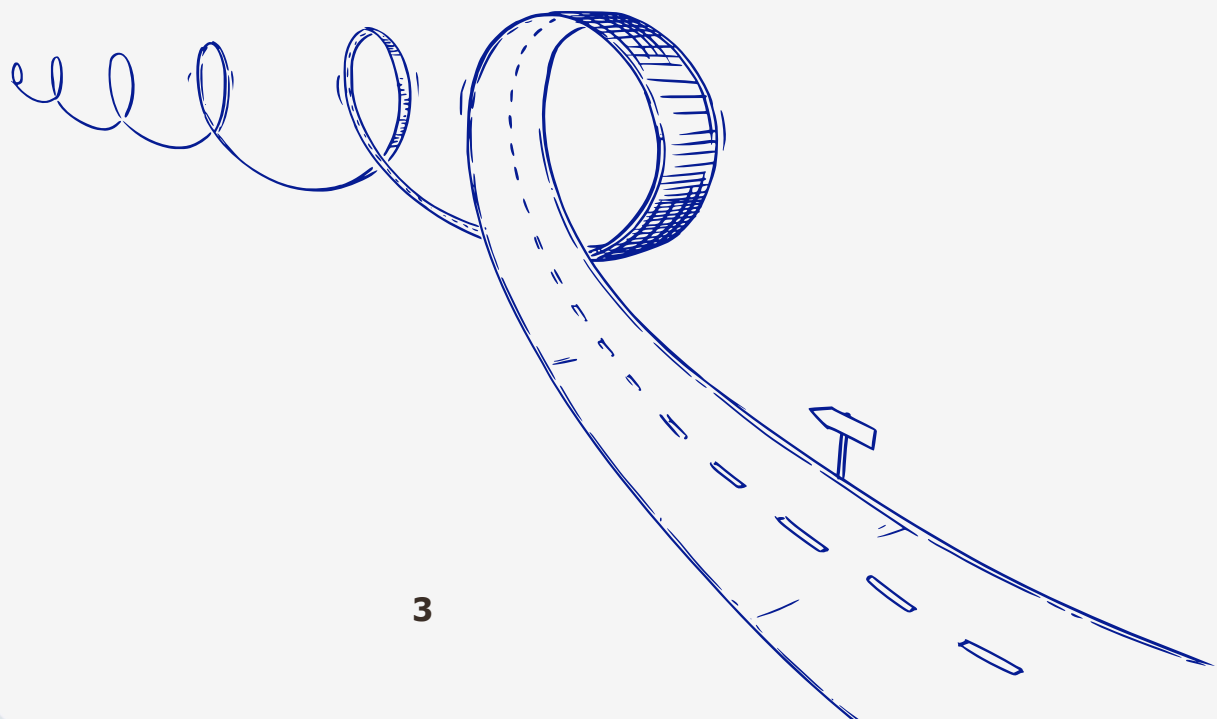



# From Fiumicino Airport...

## ... to the **BASILICA OF SAINT JOHN LATERAN**


Reaching the heart of Rome from Leonardo da Vinci International Airport (Fiumicino) is the first step toward immersing yourself in the millennia-old history of the Eternal City. This guide is designed to provide clear, practical, and up-to-date information on how to reach the Basilica of Saint John Lateran—the cathedral of Rome and the official seat of the Pope—in a way that is accessible and safe for everyone.

There are several valid options for completing this journey, each with different characteristics in terms of travel time, comfort, and accessibility.






**Option 1:** Connection to **Roma Termini Station**, the city's main railway hub, from which you can easily continue to the Basilica by bus, metro, or other accessible services.

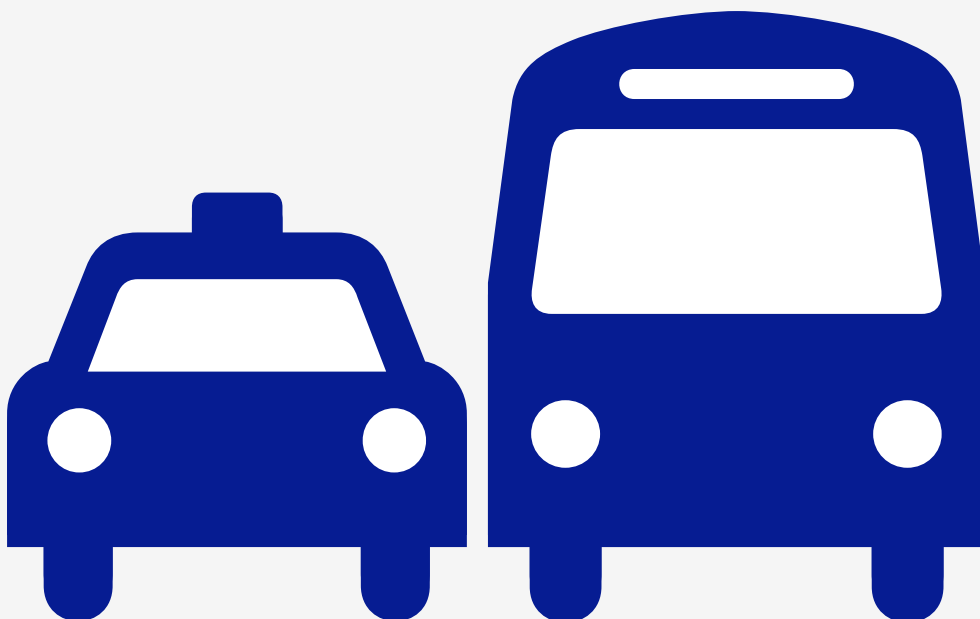


**Option 2:** Direct connection via private services, accessible taxis, or dedicated shuttle services—ideal for those who wish, or need, to minimize transfers.

**Note:** The number of accessible vehicles is limited; advance booking is therefore recommended.



**Option 3: Care to Fly service** for passengers with reduced mobility.



This guide will help you choose the route best suited to your needs, with detailed information on:

- Accessibility of transport services
- Assistance services available at the airport and stations
- Architectural barriers along the route
- Travel times and recommended solutions for travelers with disabilities

Whatever option you choose, the goal is the same: to reach the **Basilica of Saint John Lateran** easily, safely, and accessibly, so you can begin your visit to Rome in the best possible way.



## **OPTION 1: LEONARDO EXPRESS TRAIN + METRO LINE A**

### **Leonardo Express Train**

You can reach the **Leonardo Express train** from Fiumicino Airport by following the clearly marked route connecting Terminals 1 and 3 directly to the **Fiumicino Airport railway station**. The pedestrian route from the terminals to the station is fully accessible, featuring wide corridors, elevators, extended moving walkways, and LOGES tactile paths to overcome level differences. Ramps with handrails on both sides and clear visual signage are also available.

Fiumicino Airport Station is equipped with accessible turnstiles, accessible ticket machines, accessible platforms, and both visual and audio announcements.

The train runs directly to **Roma Termini**, with no intermediate stops, reaching the station in **about 32 minutes**, usually arriving at **platform 24**.

It is fully accessible for wheelchair users: it features reserved seating and equipped restrooms. Both audio and visual announcements are available.

Assistance services are available at both Fiumicino Airport Station and Roma Termini.

**Guide dogs** travel free of charge, and other pets are also allowed if carried in appropriate carriers.

## **Metro Line A**

From **Roma Termini Station**, take **Metro Line A** toward "**Anagnina**" and get off at "**San Giovanni**".

Termini Station is equipped with clear signage, full LOGES tactile paths, a tactile map, and both visual and audio guidance.

You can move between the different levels of the station by:

- **Using the station stairlift with your wheelchair**
- **Using moving walkways, accessible turnstiles, and elevators**

**Note:** Handrails are absent in some station corridors.

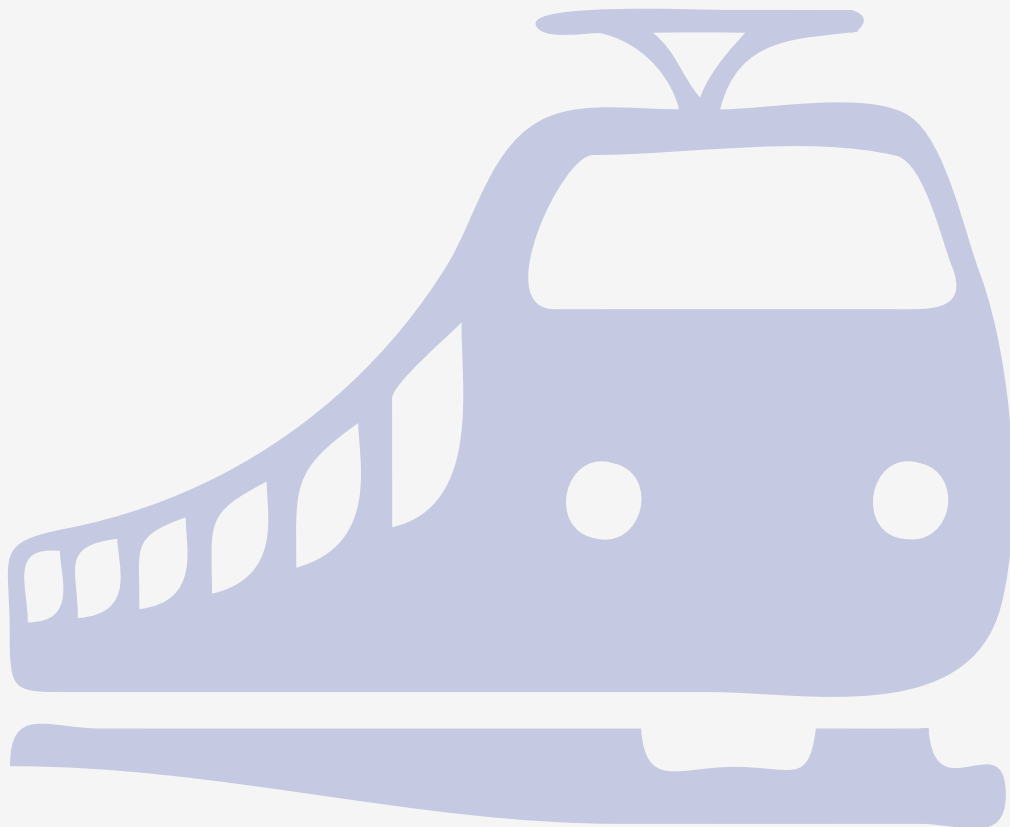
From **San Giovanni Station**, follow the main exit "**Piazza San Giovanni in Laterano**". The Basilica overlooks the square and is approximately 200 meters away.

**San Giovanni Station** features a tactile map, visual signage, accessible turnstiles, partial LOGES paths, and elevators.

**Note:** Handrails are absent in the station corridors.

- To reach the side entrance of the Basilica, you can use clearly marked pedestrian crossings equipped with accessible ramps and tactile paving.

**Note:** Along the pedestrian route, tactile and acoustic signage is only partially available; LOGES paths are absent, and not all crossings are equipped with acoustic traffic signals or corresponding visual indicators.



## OPTION 2: TAXI

**Taxi service** is available at the Arrivals areas of Terminals 1 and 3 and can take you directly to your destination.

Fares, set by the Municipality of Rome and the Municipality of Fiumicino, may change without notice. It is recommended to check the official website [romamobilita.it](http://romamobilita.it) for updates and verification.

Authorized taxis are easy to identify: they are white vehicles with a "TAXI" sign on the roof and a visible license number on the doors, rear, and inside the vehicle.

**Note:** Not all taxis are accessible. To ensure availability, it is advisable to book in advance and specify the need for an equipped vehicle.

For some destinations, a **fixed fare** is applied, which includes all surcharges. You can download the **updated price list** directly online.

Arrival may take place in the square in front of the Basilica. The drop-off point is accessible, with a smooth ramp, and the waiting area at the security checkpoint is spacious and free of significant level changes.



## Fixed Taxi Fares to/from Fiumicino Airport

For some destinations, **fixed fares** apply, which include any additional charges:

- **Rome city center (within the Aurelian Walls): € 55.00**
- **Tiburtina Station: € 60.00**
- **Ostiense Station: € 50.00**

Trips starting or ending within the **Grande Raccordo Anulare (ring road)** and heading to/from the airport must not exceed **€ 80.00**.

For all other destinations not covered by **fixed fares**, a **minimum fare of € 35.00** applies.

- Advance booking is recommended, requesting a vehicle equipped with a ramp and space for a wheelchair.
- **Fixed fare** for official taxis: **€ 55.00** for the route from Fiumicino to the city center, though additional charges may apply for special vehicles.

## OPTION 3: CARE TO FLY

**Care to Fly** is a door-to-door transfer service designed for passengers with reduced mobility when traveling to or from **Fiumicino** and **Ciampino** airports. The service is offered in collaboration with **ADR Assistance**, which provides free ground assistance for those requiring support within airport routes.

The vehicles used are specially equipped to meet the specific needs of each traveler, ensuring a safe and comfortable transfer.

You will be welcomed directly at your seat on the aircraft and accompanied all the way to the vehicle that will take you to your chosen destination.

### **Accessibility at the Basilica of Saint John Lateran:**

- There is a main access ramp; internal ramps, three platforms on the main portico, and one internal platform providing access to the Basilica transept.
- The Holy Door is equipped with a dedicated ramp.

**Note:** The Basilica features uneven flooring. LOGES paths and tactile maps are not available.



### **Tickets and Access:**

- **Entrance to the Basilica is free. The Lateran Palace offers free admission to visitors with a disability rating of 74% or higher, including one accompanying person.**
- You must present documentation certifying eligibility for free admission at the entrance.
