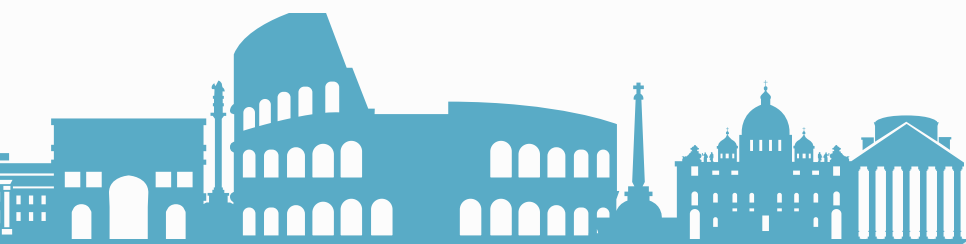

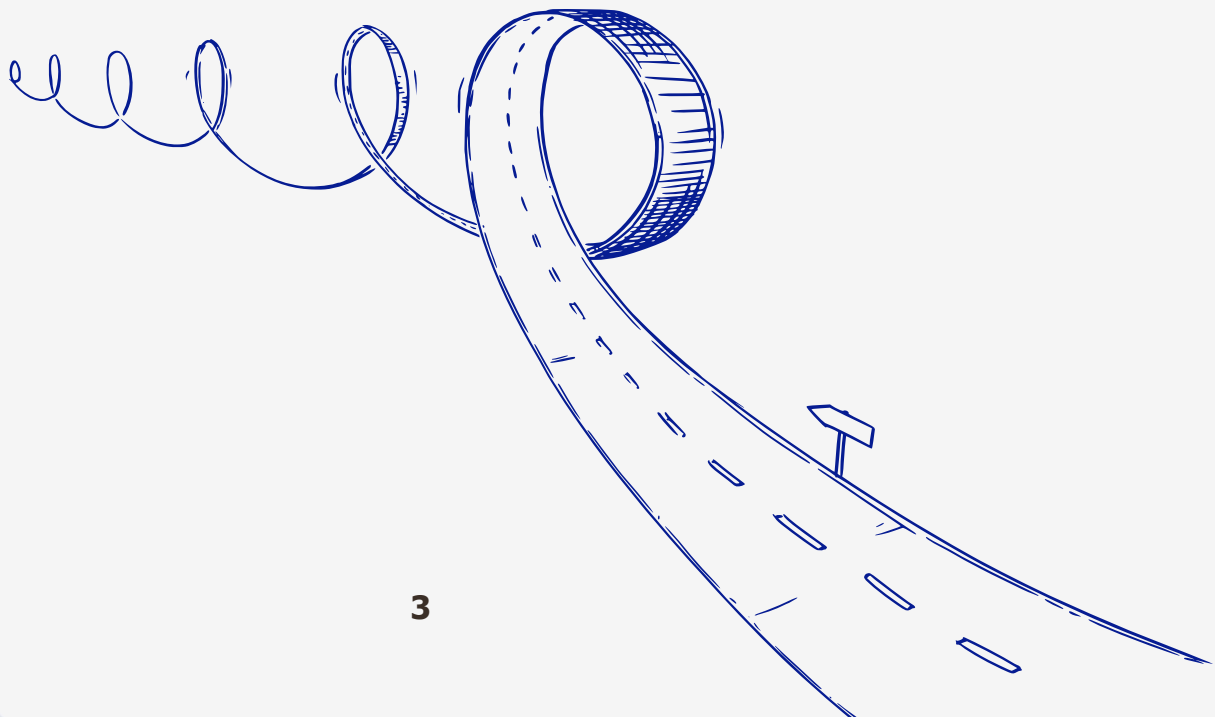



# From Fiumicino Airport...

## ... to SAINT PETER'S BASILICA


Reaching the heart of Rome from Leonardo da Vinci International Airport (Fiumicino) is the first step toward immersing yourself in the millennia-old history of the Eternal City. This guide is designed to provide clear, practical, and up-to-date information on how to reach Saint Peter's Basilica—the largest basilica in the world and the heart of the Vatican—in an accessible and safe way for everyone.

There are several valid options for completing this journey, each with different characteristics in terms of time, comfort, and accessibility.






**Option 1:** Connection to **Roma Termini Station**, the city's main railway hub, from which it is possible to continue toward the Basilica by taking an **FL3 train**.

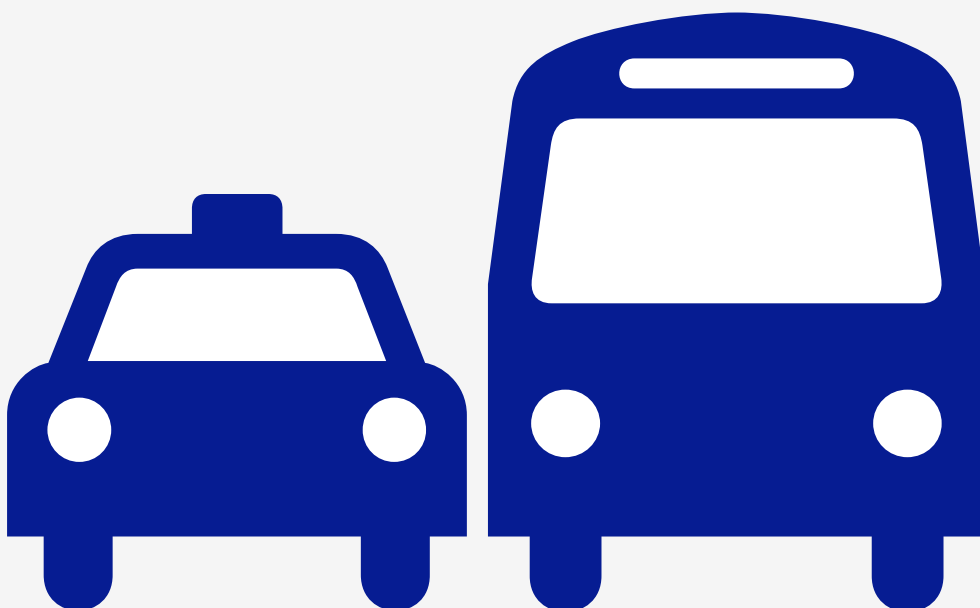


**Option 2:** Direct connection via private services, accessible taxis, or dedicated shuttle services, ideal for those who wish or need to minimize transfers.

**Note:** The number of accessible vehicles is limited, therefore advance booking is recommended.



**Option 3: Care to Fly service** for people with reduced mobility.



This guide helps you choose the route best suited to your needs, with detailed information on:

- Accessibility of transport services
- Assistance services available at the airport and in stations
- Architectural barriers along the route
- Travel times and recommended solutions for travelers with disabilities

Whatever means of transport you choose, the goal is one: to reach **Saint Peter's Basilica** easily, safely, and accessibly, to begin your visit to the Eternal City in the best possible way.



## **OPTION 1: FAST TRAIN + FL3 TRAIN**

### **Leonardo Express Train**

You can reach the **Leonardo Express train** from Fiumicino Airport by following the marked route connecting Terminals 1 and 3 directly to **Fiumicino Airport railway station**. The pedestrian route from the terminals to the station is fully accessible, with wide corridors, elevators, extended moving walkways, and LOGES tactile paths to overcome level differences. Ramps with handrails on both sides and clear visual signage are also available.

Fiumicino Airport Station is equipped with accessible turnstiles, accessible ticket machines, accessible platforms, and both visual and audio announcements.

The train runs directly to **Roma Termini**, with no intermediate stops; in **32 minutes** you reach Roma Termini station, usually at **platform 24**.

Fully accessible for wheelchairs: it is equipped with reserved seating and accessible restrooms. Audio and visual announcements are available.

Assistance services are available at both Fiumicino Airport Station and Roma Termini.

**Guide dogs** travel free of charge, and other pets are allowed in carriers. This is the best combination of speed, continuity, and accessibility.

## **FL3 Train**

**From Roma Termini Station, take an FL3 train toward Civitavecchia, Viterbo, or Cesano and get off at Roma San Pietro.**

**Roma Termini Station** is equipped with elevators, lifting platforms, moving walkways, accessible turnstiles, and LOGES tactile paving throughout. A tactile map is available at the entrance.

You can move between levels by:

- **Using the station stairlift with your wheelchair**
- **Using moving walkways, accessible turnstiles, and elevators**

**Note:** Handrails are absent in some station corridors.

The regional train is equipped with a boarding ramp and reserved spaces.

**Roma San Pietro Station** features LOGES paths and a tactile map, ramps, and visual signage. Elevators are available to access platforms, and corridors have smooth flooring.

**Note:** Onboard announcements are only audio; handrails are absent in corridors, and lifting platforms are not available in the station..

From **Roma San Pietro Station**, take the exit onto **Via della Stazione di San Pietro**. The station is fully accessible and equipped with elevators. The route to the Basilica is **approximately 800 meters** long, mostly flat, with sidewalks equipped with curb ramps. The route includes LOGES paths, tactile signage, and acoustic traffic signals.

- Accessible taxis are available outside the station.



## OPTION 2: TAXI

**Taxi service** is available at the Arrivals areas of Terminals 1 and 3 and can take you directly to your destination.

Fares, set by the Municipality of Rome and the Municipality of Fiumicino, may change without notice. It is recommended to check [romamobilita.it](http://romamobilita.it) for updates.

Authorized taxis are white vehicles with a "TAXI" sign on the roof and a visible license number.

**Note:** Not all taxis are accessible. It is recommended to book in advance specifying the need for an equipped vehicle.

For some destinations, a **fixed fare** is applied, which includes all surcharges. You can download the **updated price list** directly online.

## Fixed Taxi Fares to/from Fiumicino Airport

For some destinations, **fixed fares** apply, which include any additional charges:

- **Rome city center (within the Aurelian Walls): € 55.00**
- **Tiburtina Station: € 60.00**
- **Ostiense Station: € 50.00**

Trips starting or ending within the **Grande Raccordo Anulare (ring road)** and heading to/from the airport must not exceed **€ 80.00**.

For all other destinations not covered by **fixed fares**, a **minimum fare of € 35.00** applies.

- Advance booking is recommended, requesting a vehicle equipped with a ramp and space for a wheelchair.
- **Fixed fare** for official taxis: **€ 55.00** for the route from Fiumicino to the city center (including the Colosseum), though additional charges may apply for special vehicles.

## **OPTION 3: CARE TO FLY**

**Care to Fly** is a door-to-door transfer service designed for passengers with reduced mobility when traveling to or from **Fiumicino** and **Ciampino** airports. The service is offered in collaboration with ADR Assistance.

Vehicles are equipped to meet specific needs, ensuring safe and comfortable transfers.

You will be welcomed directly at your seat on the aircraft and accompanied to your vehicle.

## Accessibility at Saint Peter's Basilica:

- An accessible entrance is located on the right side of Bernini's colonnade, where a ramp leads directly into the Basilica. The interior is free of significant architectural barriers.
- The five entrance doors, including the Holy Door, are equipped with ramps.

The central nave and main chapels are fully accessible by wheelchair..



## Tickets and Access

- **Entrance to the Basilica is free. Tickets for the Dome and the Vatican Museums are free for visitors with a disability rating of 74% or higher**, including one accompanying person.
- People with disabilities and their companions have priority access to the Basilica without additional booking.
- You must present documentation certifying eligibility for free admission at the entrance.
