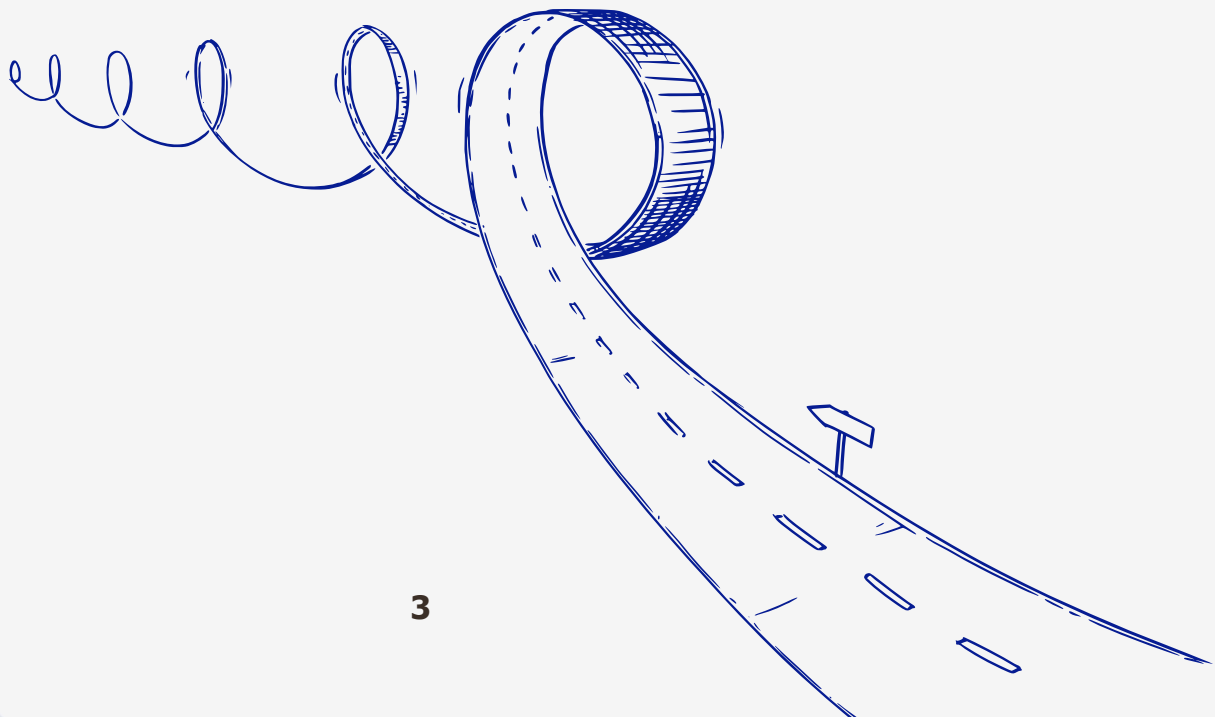



From Fiumicino Airport...

... to the **BASILICA OF SANTA MARIA MAGGIORE**


Reaching the heart of Rome from Leonardo da Vinci International Airport (Fiumicino) is the first step toward immersing yourself in the millennia-old history of the Eternal City. This guide is designed to provide clear, practical, and up-to-date information on how to reach the Basilica of Santa Maria Maggiore, the largest Marian church in Rome, in an accessible and safe way for everyone.

There are several valid options for completing this journey, each with different characteristics in terms of time, comfort, and accessibility.






Option 1: Connection to **Roma Termini Station**, the city's main railway hub, from which it is possible to continue toward the Basilica on foot, by bus, metro, or other accessible services.

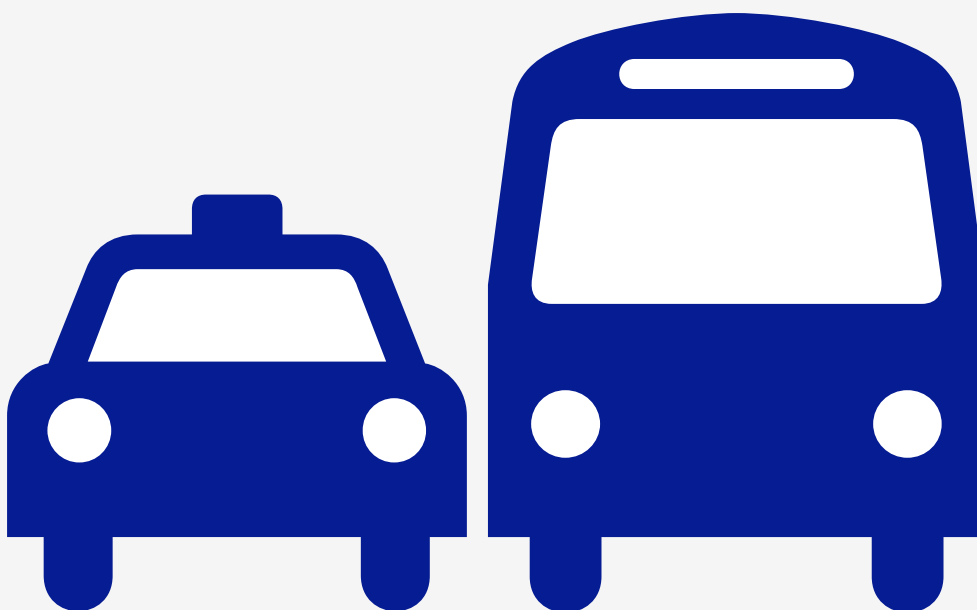


Option 2: Direct connection via private services, accessible taxis, or dedicated shuttle services, ideal for those who wish or need to minimize transfers.

Note: The number of accessible vehicles is limited, therefore advance booking is recommended.



Option 3: Care to Fly service for people with reduced mobility.



This guide helps you choose the route best suited to your needs, with detailed information on:

- Accessibility of transport services
- Assistance services available at the airport and in stations
- Architectural barriers along the route
- Travel times and recommended solutions for travelers with disabilities

Whatever means of transport you choose, the goal is one: to reach the **Basilica of Santa Maria Maggiore** easily, safely, and accessibly, to begin your visit to the Eternal City in the best possible way



OPTION 1: FAST TRAIN

Leonardo Express Train

You can reach the **Leonardo Express train** from Fiumicino by following the marked route connecting the terminals directly to Fiumicino Airport railway station, accessible via moving walkways and elevators. The pedestrian route from the terminals to the station is fully accessible, with wide corridors, extended moving walkways, and LOGES tactile paths to overcome level differences, as well as ramps equipped with handrails on both sides.

Direct train to **Roma Termini**, with no intermediate stops; in **32 minutes** you reach **Roma Termini Station**, usually at **platform 24**.

Fully accessible for wheelchairs: it is equipped with reserved seating, accessible restrooms, doors, and visual display systems. Both audio and visual announcements are available.

Assistance services are present in the station (elevators, ramps) both at Fiumicino and Termini.

Guide dogs travel free of charge, and the train also accommodates other animals in carriers.

La **Roma Termini Station** is equipped with clear signage, full LOGES tactile paths, a tactile map, and both visual and audio information.

You can move between the different levels of the station by:

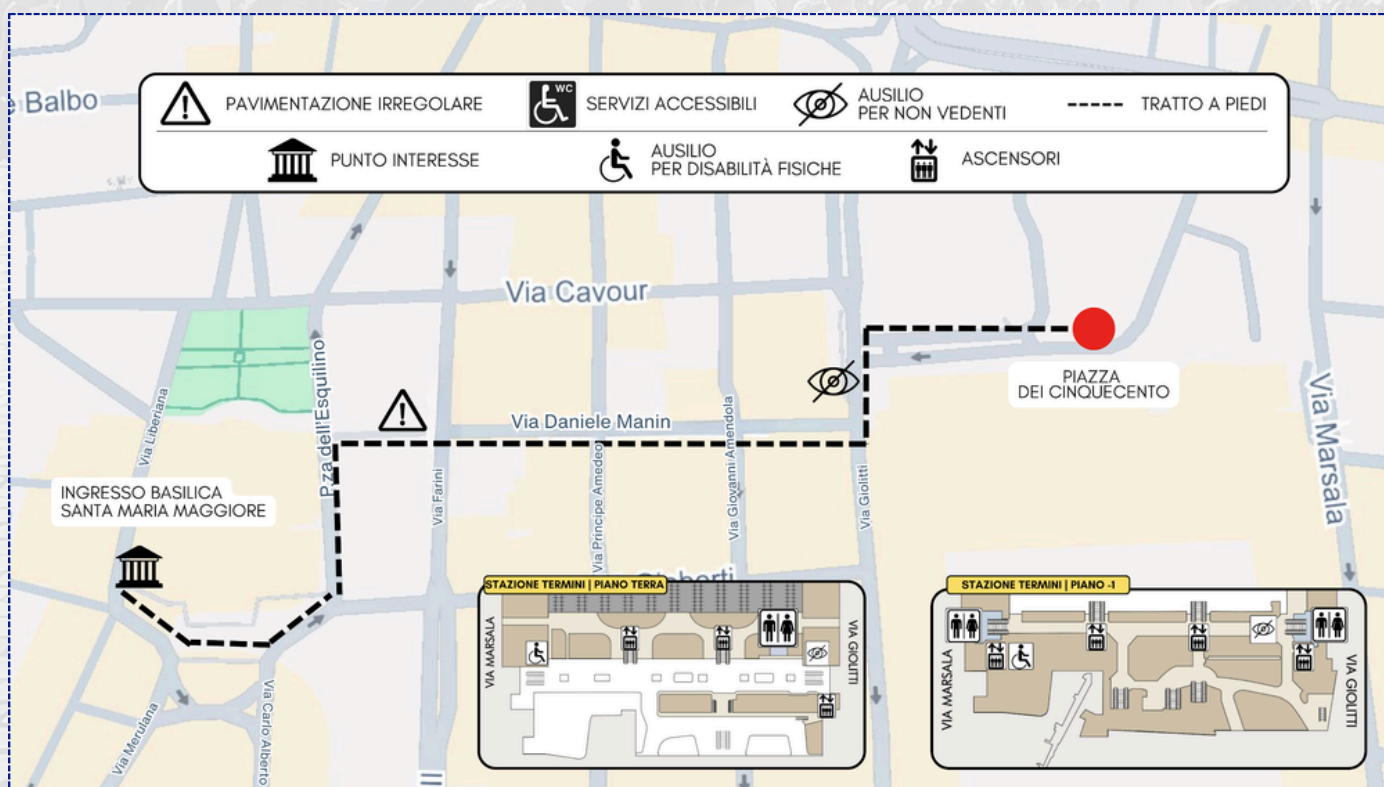
- **Using the station stairlift with your wheelchair**
- **Using moving walkways, accessible turnstiles, and elevators**

Note: Handrails are absent in some station corridors.



From the **Roma Termini** exit on the **Via Giolitti / Piazza dei Cinquecento** side, the Basilica is **approximately 500 meters** away along **Via Daniele Manin**. The pedestrian route is partly uneven, with wide sidewalks equipped with curb ramps. The route includes LOGES at pedestrian crossings, tactile signage, and acoustic traffic signals.

Cross three streets—**Via Giovanni Amendola, Via Principe Amedeo, and Via Farini**—then continue to **Via dell'Esquilino**. At the intersection with **Via Gioberti**, continue for **50 meters** until you reach the square in front of the Basilica.



OPTION 2: TAXI

Taxi service is available at the Arrivals areas of Terminals 1 and 3 and can take you directly to your destination.

Fares, set by the Municipality of Rome and the Municipality of Fiumicino, may change without notice. It is recommended to check [romamobilita.it](https://www.romamobilita.it) for updates.

Authorized taxis are white vehicles with a "TAXI" sign on the roof and a visible license number.

Note: Not all taxis are accessible. It is recommended to book in advance specifying the need for an equipped vehicle.

For some destinations, a **fixed fare** is applied, which includes all surcharges. You can download the **updated price list** directly online.

Fixed Taxi Fares to/from Fiumicino Airport

For some destinations, **fixed fares** apply, which include any additional charges:

- **Rome city center (within the Aurelian Walls): € 55.00**
- **Tiburtina Station: € 60.00**
- **Ostiense Station: € 50.00**

Trips starting or ending within the **Grande Raccordo Anulare (ring road)** and heading to/from the airport must not exceed **€ 80.00**.

For all other destinations not covered by **fixed fares**, a **minimum fare of € 35.00** applies.

- Advance booking is recommended, requesting a vehicle equipped with a ramp and space for a wheelchair.
- **Fixed fare** for official taxis: **€ 55.00** for the route from Fiumicino to the city center (including the Colosseum), though additional charges may apply for special vehicles.

OPTION 3: CARE TO FLY

Care to Fly is a door-to-door transfer service designed for passengers with reduced mobility when traveling to or from **Fiumicino** and **Ciampino** airports. The service is offered in collaboration with ADR Assistance.

Vehicles are equipped to meet specific needs, ensuring safe and comfortable transfers.

You will be welcomed directly at your seat on the aircraft and accompanied to your vehicle.

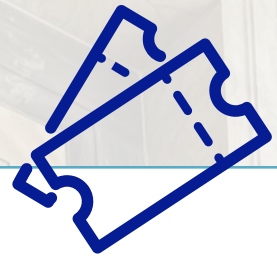

Tickets and Access

- The accessible entrance with ramp is located on the left side of the Basilica, where there is a security checkpoint with a metal detector and a ramp with handrails.
- The flooring is generally even; however, some internal areas such as the baptistery, the sacristy, the bookshop, and the bar are only accessible via steps and do not have ramps.
- **Entrance to the Basilica is free.** For certain areas, such as **the Basilica Museum or special sections**, tickets may be required, with possible free or reduced admission for visitors with disabilities, also extended to accompanying persons, to be verified on site.
- You must present documentation certifying eligibility for free admission at the entrance.
