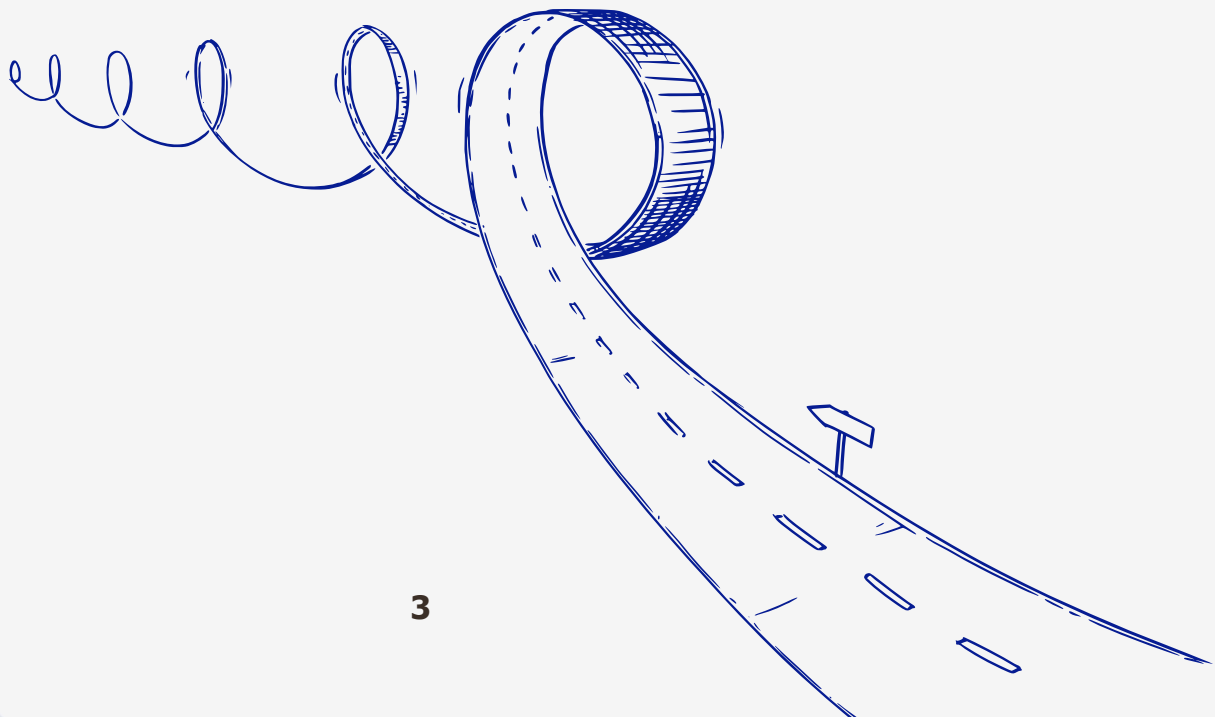



# From Roma Termini Railway Station...

## ... to **CAMPIDOGLIO**, the **THEATRE OF MARCELLUS** and **TIBER ISLAND**


Reaching the historic heart of Rome from Roma Termini railway station marks the beginning of a journey through the timeless heritage of the Eternal City. This guide offers clear, practical, and up-to-date information on how to reach Campidoglio, the Theatre of Marcellus, and Tiber Island in a way that is accessible, safe, and suitable for all visitors.

Several travel options are available, each differing in terms of duration, comfort, and level of accessibility.



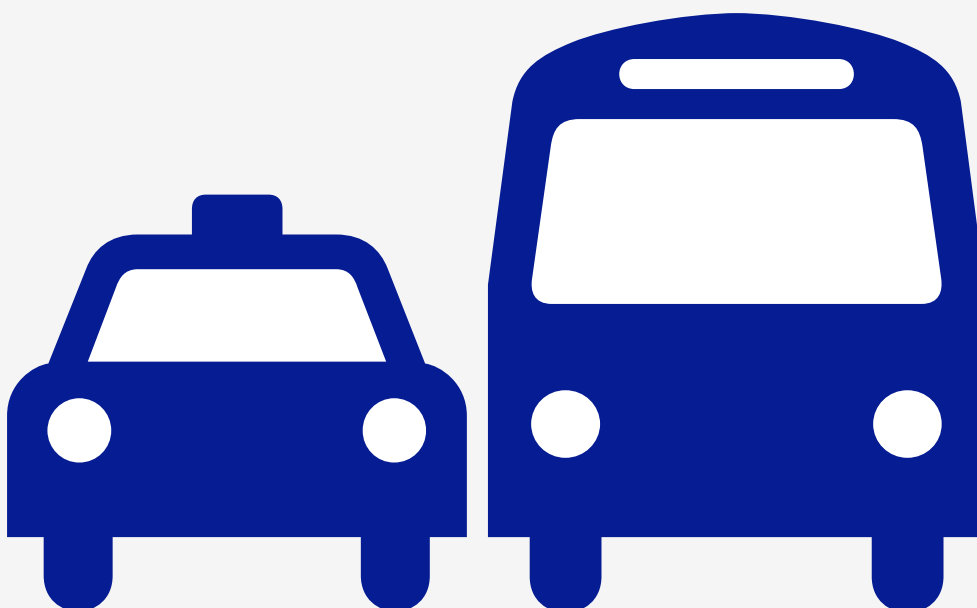


**Option 1:** Continue from **Roma Termini Station** using accessible bus lines equipped with ramps and dedicated wheelchair spaces.



**Option 2:** Choose a direct connection via private services, accessible taxis, or dedicated shuttle services—particularly suitable for those wishing to minimize transfers.

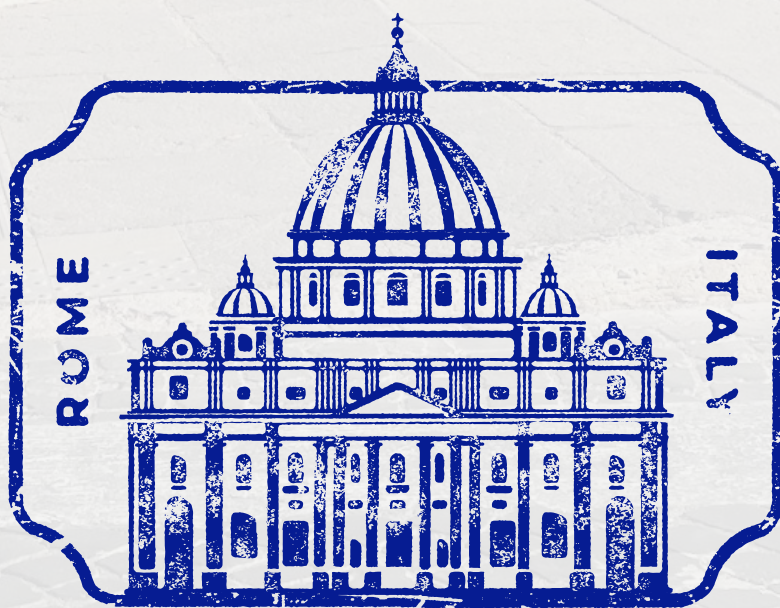
**Note:** The number of accessible vehicles is limited; advance booking is strongly recommended.



This guide is designed to support you in selecting the most suitable route, offering detailed information on:

- Accessibility of transport services
- Assistance available within the station
- Architectural barriers along the route
- Travel times and recommended solutions for passengers with disabilities

Whichever option you choose, the aim remains the same: to reach **Campidoglio**, the **Theatre of Marcellus**, and **Tiber Island** comfortably, safely, and with ease—allowing you to begin your experience of Rome in the best possible way.



## OPTION 1: BUS

From Roma Termini, make your way to the **Piazza dei Cinquecento exit**, where the bus terminal is located

The station is well equipped with clear signage, comprehensive LOGES tactile paving, tactile maps, and both visual and audio information systems.

Movement between different levels of the station is facilitated by:

- **Stairlifts suitable for wheelchair users**
- **Moving walkways, accessible gates, and elevators**

**Note:** Handrails are not available in some station corridors.

To reach Campidoglio, take **Bus Line H (Termini – Dei Capasso)** or alternatively **Line 170 (Termini – Agricoltura)**.

The route to the bus terminal is straightforward, with step-free access, smooth surfaces, and clear signage throughout.

Both lines operate accessible vehicles equipped with manual ramps and designated wheelchair spaces.

The journey to the **Ara Coeli / Piazza Venezia stop** takes approximately **25 minutes**. Onboard systems provide both audio announcements and visual stop indicators.

## Walking route to Campidoglio

- From the **Ara Coeli / Piazza Venezia stop**, head toward the fountain in **Piazza d'Aracoeli** and follow a level route leading to the crossing on **Via di San Venanzio**. Although the crossing is not traffic-light controlled, it is clearly marked with pedestrian lines.
- After crossing, continue along uninterrupted sidewalks without steps. Ramps are available where needed, allowing access toward the pedestrian area of **Via del Teatro di Marcello**.
- At the base of the Capitoline Hill, near the Campidoglio steps, the pathway narrows and continues along **Via delle Tre Pile**—an uphill street leading to **Piazza del Campidoglio**. While the route remains continuous and step-free, it is characterized by cobblestone paving and a steady incline.
- Although accessible, the route includes sections without traffic lights, narrow passages, and surfaces that may require additional attention.



## Panoramic viewpoint over the Roman Forum

- From **Piazza del Campidoglio**, cross the central square. Access points are marked by bollards connected with chains, while side openings allow passage for wheelchair users.
- After **approximately 30 meters**, you reach the panoramic terrace: a spacious, level area offering unobstructed access to the viewpoint.
- The route is fully step-free; however, tactile safety features and dedicated signage are not present.



## Walking route to the Theatre of Marcellus

- From **Piazza del Campidoglio**, follow **Via delle Tre Pile downhill**.  
The route is continuous and step-free, though it includes cobblestone paving, a consistent slope, and some curves.
- At the junction with **Via del Teatro di Marcello**, turn left and continue for **approximately 150 meters**. The path is level and leads to a crossing equipped with a ramp, though without traffic lights.
- Turn right to reach the entrance to the Theatre.

## Walking route to Tiber Island

- The archaeological area features a cobbled ramp leading to **Largo 16 Ottobre 1943**, from where you can proceed toward **Via del Portico d'Ottavia**.
- Continue along a short stretch of roadway paved with cobblestones and shared with parked vehicles.
- Proceed to the pedestrian crossing at **Piazza Gerusalemme**, which is traffic-light controlled and equipped with an appropriate ramp.
- Continue toward **Lungotevere dei Pierleoni** and follow the route to **Ponte Fabricio**. The bridge is accessible, although its cobblestone surface and two fixed barriers create a narrowed passage.
- From there, take **Via di Ponte Quattro Capi** to reach **Piazza San Bartolomeo all'Isola**.

## OPTION 2: TAXI

**Taxi services** are clearly signposted outside the main station entrance on the Via Marsala side.

In this area, some vehicles are equipped for passengers with disabilities, featuring ramps and dedicated wheelchair space. Vehicles may include retractable ramps or swivel seats.

The area is level, equipped with LOGES tactile paving, and free from architectural barriers. Access to taxis is direct, with staff assistance available if required.

Fares are regulated by the Municipality of Rome and may be subject to change without prior notice. It is advisable to consult the official website [romamobilita.it](http://romamobilita.it) or the latest updates.

Licensed taxis are easily identifiable: white vehicles with a "TAXI" sign on the roof and a visible license number displayed on the doors, rear, and inside the vehicle.

**Note:** Not all taxis are accessible. To ensure availability, it is recommended to book in advance and request a specially equipped vehicle.





### **Accessibility at Piazza del Campidoglio:**

- Access routes are continuous and step-free
- Ramps are available at key crossing points
- The square is largely accessible to wheelchair users, with open and easily navigable spaces
- The panoramic viewpoint over the Roman Forum is barrier-free

**Note:** Cobblestone paving and the steady incline of access routes may present challenges for some visitors.



### **Tickets and Access:**

Access to Piazza del Campidoglio and the panoramic viewpoint is free of charge.

### **Accessibility at the Theatre of Marcellus (external area):**

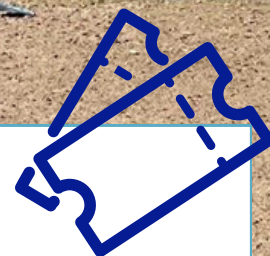
- The Theatre of Marcellus is an open-air monument and can be accessed without physical barriers
- External routes are step-free and allow close proximity to the monument
- Ramps are available at main crossings

**Note:** Surfaces may be uneven, and temporary obstacles such as bicycles, crowds, or bus stops may be encountered. Some crossings are not traffic-light controlled.

### **Tickets and Access:**

The external area of the Theatre of Marcellus is freely accessible.

Access to interior areas or special events may require a ticket.



## Accessibility at Tiber Island – San Bartolomeo

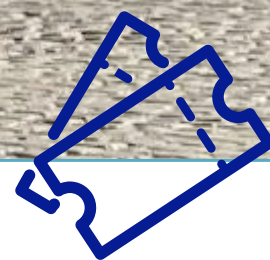
- Tiber Island can be reached **via Ponte Fabricio**, which is accessible to wheelchair users
- The route is continuous and step-free, with ramps available at key points
- Piazza San Bartolomeo allows for easy movement and stopping

**Note:** Cobblestones, narrowed passages due to barriers and chains, and irregularly parked vehicles may temporarily reduce available space.

## Tickets and Access:

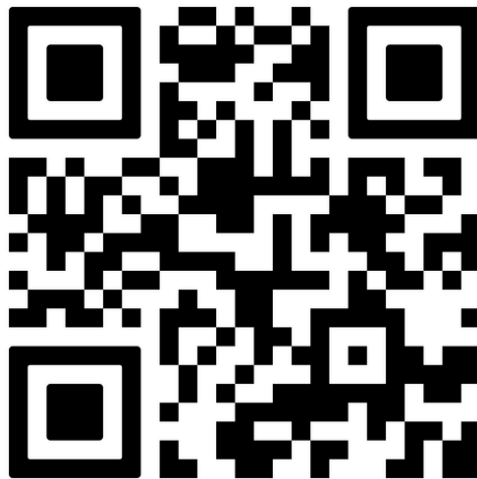
Access to Tiber Island and Piazza San Bartolomeo is free of charge.

The Basilica of San Bartolomeo all'Isola can be visited free of charge, subject to opening hours and religious services.
