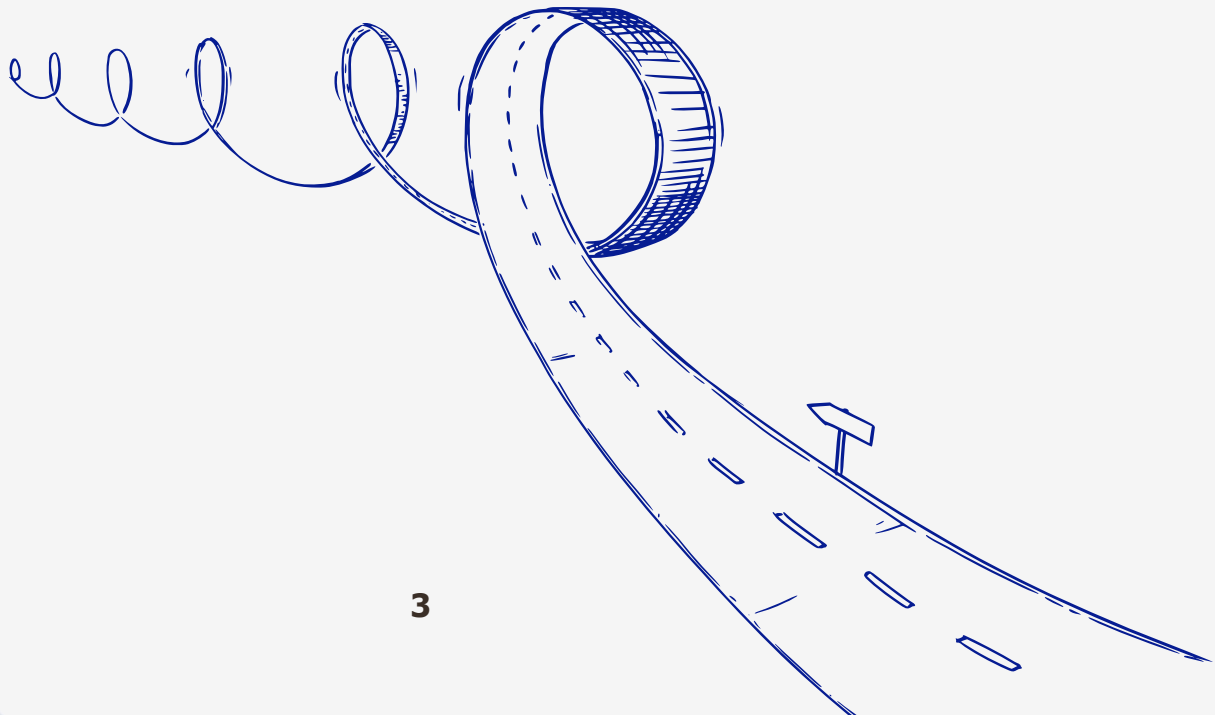



From Roma Termini Railway Station...

... to the **COLOSSEUM** and the **ROMAN FORUM**


Reaching the archaeological heart of Rome from Roma Termini railway station marks the beginning of an extraordinary journey into one of the most ancient and iconic heritage sites in the world. This guide provides clear, practical, and up-to-date information on how to reach the Colosseum and the Roman Forum in a way that is accessible, safe, and suitable for all visitors.

Several travel options are available, each offering different advantages in terms of travel time, comfort, and accessibility



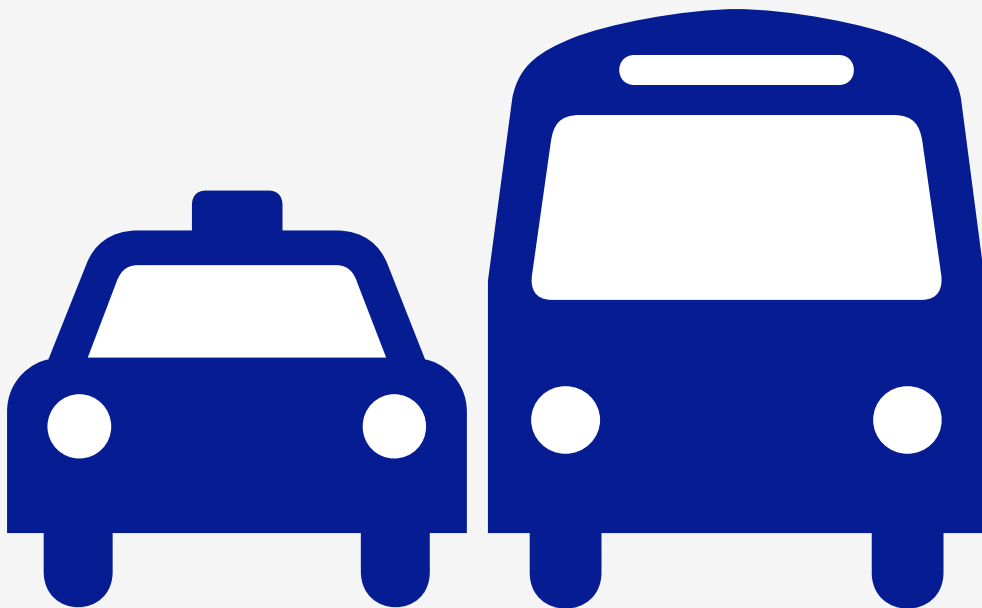


Option 1: Take **Metro Line B** toward “**Laurentina**” and get off at **Colosseo station**. The station is equipped with elevators and accessible routes.



Option 2: Choose a direct connection via private services, accessible taxis, or dedicated shuttle services—ideal for those who prefer, or require, minimal transfers.

Note: The number of accessible vehicles is limited; advance booking is strongly recommended.

This guide will help you choose the most suitable route based on your needs, providing detailed information on:

- Transport accessibility
- Assistance services available at the station
- Architectural barriers along the route
- Travel times and recommended solutions for passengers with disabilities

Whatever option you choose, the goal remains the same: to reach the **Colosseum** and the **Roman Forum** comfortably, safely, and with ease—so you can begin your visit to the Eternal City in the best possible way.



OPTION 1: METRO LINE B

From **Roma Termini Station**, on the **Via Marsala** side, take **Metro Line B** toward "**Laurentina**" and get off at **Colosseo station**.

Roma Termini Station is equipped with clear signage, full LOGES tactile paving, a tactile map, and both visual and audio information systems.

Movement between different station levels is facilitated by:

- **Using the station stairlift with your wheelchair**
- **Using moving walkways, accessible turnstiles, and elevators**

Note: Handrails are not available in some station corridors.

Colosseo station is partially accessible: the main routes are equipped with stairlifts, handrails, and accessible turnstiles.

From the station ramp, you can proceed toward the **Colosseum**, located directly in front of the metro exit. The route is level, and sidewalks are equipped with curb ramps.

Access to the ticket office is located along **Via dei Verbiti**, where a small ramp is available.

Note: The station lacks elevators and has only partial LOGES tactile paving.

To continue toward the entrance of the **Roman Forum**, follow the sidewalk along **Via dei Fori Imperiali** up to the intersection with **Via in Miranda**.

The route is equipped with ramps and tactile signage.

The most accessible entrance is located at the intersection with **Largo della Salara Vecchia**, on the right-hand side of the gate. The entrance is equipped with a downward ramp and an elevator.

OPTION 2: TAXI

Taxi services are clearly signposted outside the main station entrance on the Via Marsala side.

In this area, some vehicles are equipped for passengers with disabilities, featuring ramps and dedicated wheelchair space. Vehicles may include retractable ramps or swivel seats.

The area is level, equipped with LOGES tactile paving, and free from architectural barriers. Access to taxis is direct, with staff assistance available if required.

Fares are regulated by the Municipality of Rome and may be subject to change without prior notice. It is advisable to consult the official website romamobilita.it for the latest updates.

Licensed taxis are easily identifiable: white vehicles with a "TAXI" sign on the roof and a visible license number displayed on the doors, rear, and inside the vehicle.

Note: Not all taxis are accessible. To ensure availability, it is recommended to book in advance and request a specially equipped vehicle.





Accessibility at the Colosseum:

- Visitors already in possession of a ticket can proceed to the left from Colosseo station
- The accessible entrance is the side entrance, adjacent to the group and underground access, equipped with a metal ramp and smoother paving than other entrances
- The Colosseum is equipped with elevators connecting all levels
- Assistance staff are available, and wheelchairs can be provided upon request

Note: The site features uneven surfaces and historic level differences.



Accessibility at the Roman Forum:

Accessible entrance:

- **Via della Salara Vecchia:** equipped with a ramp and elevator providing access to the lower level of the Forum.



Tickets and access

- Free admission to the **Colosseum** and the Roman Forum is available for visitors with disabilities and one accompanying person, with mandatory online booking.
- Visitors must present documentation certifying eligibility for free entry.
