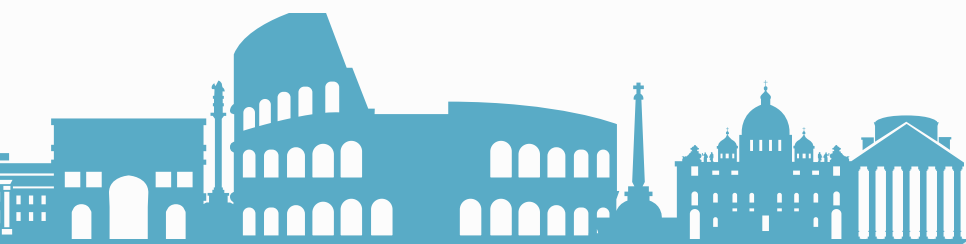

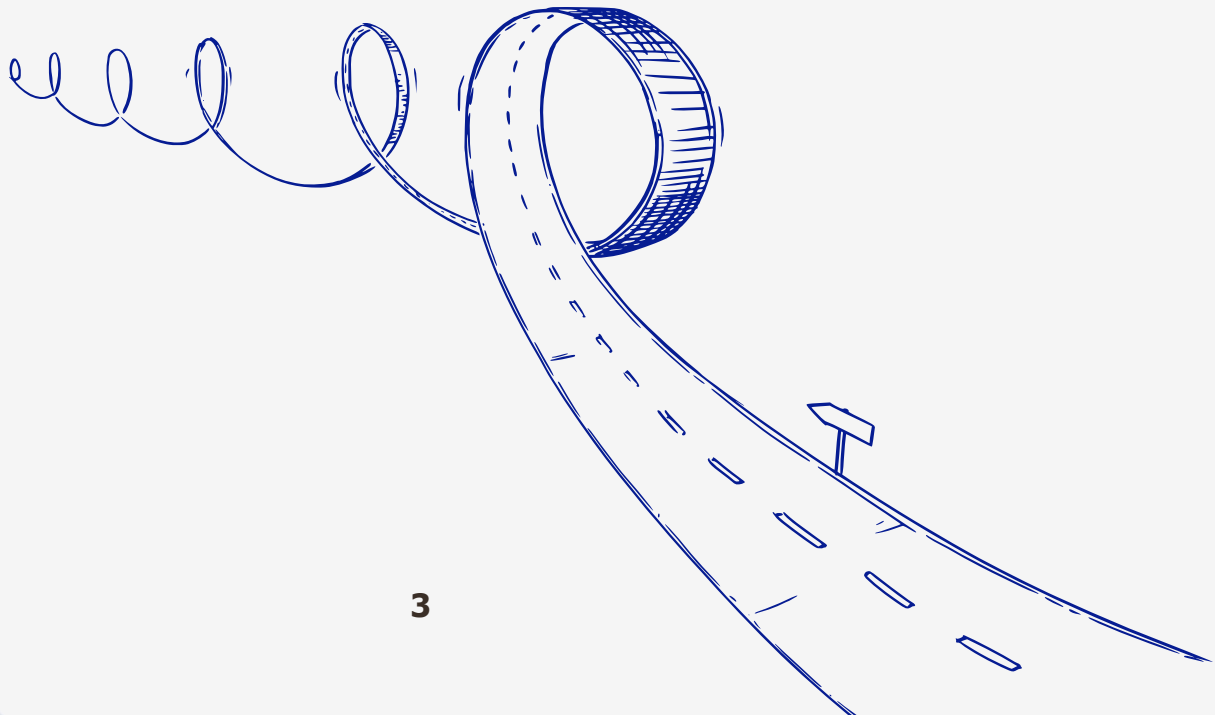


From Roma Termini Railway Station...

... to the **BASILICA OF ST JOHN LATERAN**


Reaching the heart of Rome from Roma Termini railway station marks the beginning of a journey into the spiritual and historical core of the Eternal City. This guide provides clear, practical, and up-to-date information on how to reach the Basilica of St John Lateran—the Cathedral of Rome and the official seat of the Pope—in a way that is accessible, safe, and suitable for all visitors.

Several travel options are available, each offering different advantages in terms of travel time, comfort, and accessibility.



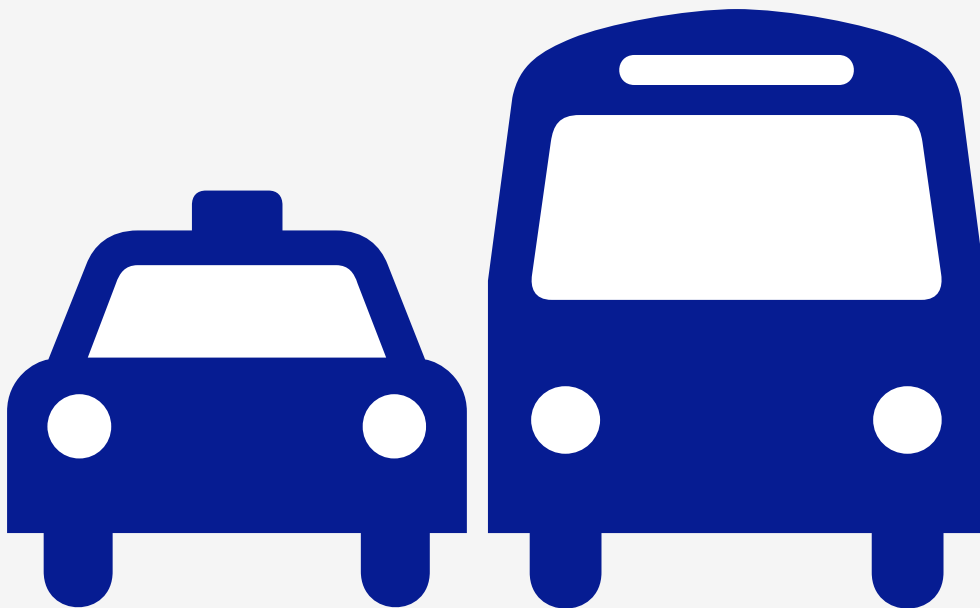


Option 1: From Roma Termini Station, take **Metro Line A** toward “Anagnina” and get off at **San Giovanni Station**.



Option 2: Choose a direct connection via private services, accessible taxis, or dedicated shuttle services—ideal for those who prefer, or require, minimal transfers.

Note: The number of accessible vehicles is limited; advance booking is strongly recommended.



This guide is designed to help you select the most suitable route based on your needs, providing detailed information on:

- Transport accessibility
- Assistance services available at the station
- Architectural barriers along the route
- Travel times and recommended solutions for passengers with disabilities

Whatever option you choose, the goal remains the same: to reach the **Basilica of St John Lateran** comfortably, safely, and with ease—so you can begin your visit to Rome in the best possible way.



OPTION 1: METRO LINE A

From Roma Termini Station, take **Metro Line A** toward “Anagnina” and get off at **San Giovanni Station**.

Roma Termini station is equipped with clear signage, full LOGES tactile paving, a tactile map, and both visual and audio information systems.

Movement between different station levels is facilitated by:

- Using the station stairlift with your wheelchair
- Using moving walkways, accessible turnstiles, and elevators

Note: Handrails are not available in some station corridors.



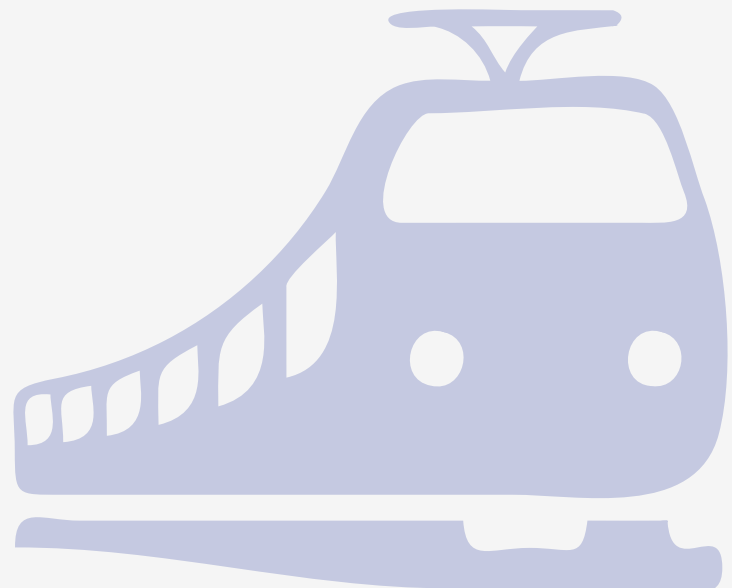
From **San Giovanni Station**, follow the main exit toward **Piazza San Giovanni in Laterano**. The Basilica overlooks the square and is located approximately **200 meters** away.

San Giovanni station is equipped with a tactile map, visual signage, accessible turnstiles, partial LOGES paving, and elevators.

Note: Handrails are not available in some station corridors.

To reach the **side entrance of the Basilica**, use the pedestrian crossings marked with clear visual signage, equipped with accessible ramps and tactile paving.

Note: Along the pedestrian route, tactile and acoustic guidance is only partially available. LOGES paving is absent in some sections, and not all crossings are equipped with acoustic traffic signals or visual indicators.



OPTION 2: TAXI

Taxi services are clearly signposted outside the main station entrance on the **Via Marsala side**.

In this area, some vehicles are equipped for passengers with disabilities, featuring ramps and dedicated wheelchair space. Vehicles may include retractable ramps or swivel seats.

The area is level, equipped with LOGES tactile paving, and free from architectural barriers. Access to taxis is direct, with staff assistance available if required.

Fares are regulated by the Municipality of Rome and may be subject to change without prior notice. It is advisable to consult the official website romamobilita.it for updates.

Licensed taxis are easily identifiable: white vehicles with a "TAXI" sign on the roof and a visible license number displayed on the doors, rear, and inside the vehicle.

Note: Not all taxis are accessible. To ensure availability, it is recommended to book in advance and request a specially equipped vehicle.

Arrival can take place directly in the square in front of the Basilica. The drop-off area is accessible, with a regular ramp, and the waiting area at the security checkpoint is spacious and free of significant level differences.



Basilica of St John Lateran:

- A main access ramp is available
- Internal ramps are present
- Three lifting platforms are installed along the main portico
- An internal platform provides access to the transept
- The Holy Door is equipped with a dedicated ramp

Note: The Basilica features uneven flooring, and both LOGES tactile paving and tactile maps are not available.



Tickets and access

- **Entry to the Basilica is free of charge. The Lateran Palace is free for visitors with a disability of 74% or higher, including one accompanying person.**
- Visitors must present documentation certifying eligibility for free entry.
