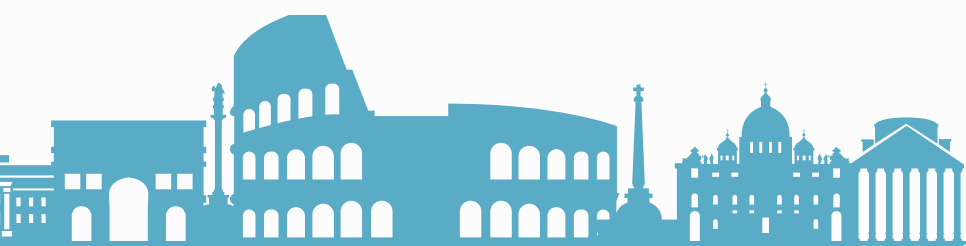

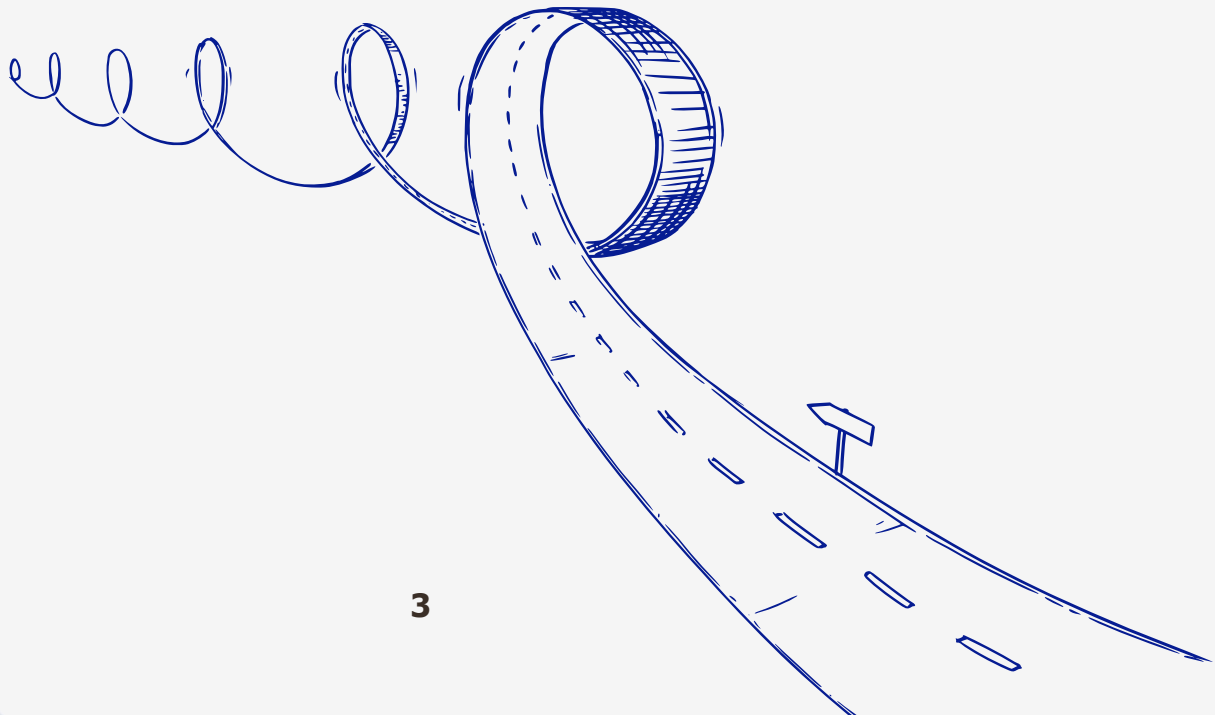



From Roma Termini Railway Station...

... to ST PETER'S BASILICA


Reaching the heart of Rome from Roma Termini railway station is the first step toward immersing yourself in the millennia-old history of the Eternal City. This guide provides clear, practical, and up-to-date information on how to reach St Peter's Basilica—the largest church in the world and the spiritual centre of the Vatican—in a way that is accessible, safe, and suitable for all visitors.

Several travel options are available, each offering different advantages in terms of travel time, comfort, and accessibility.



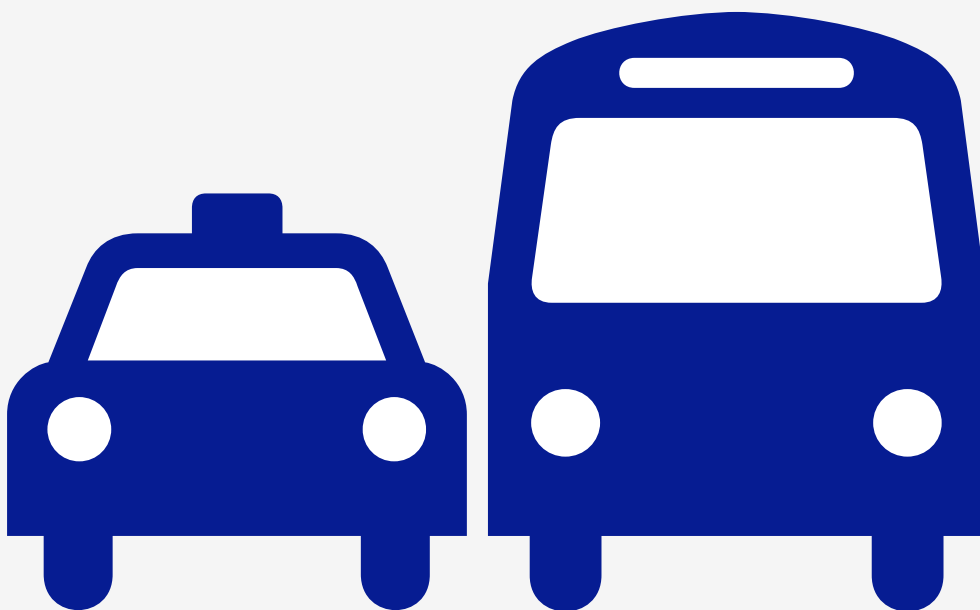


Option 1: From Roma Termini Station, take a **FL3 regional train** and get off at **Roma San Pietro Station**, then continue on foot.



Option 2: Choose a direct connection via private services, accessible taxis, or dedicated shuttle services—ideal for those who prefer, or require, minimal transfers.

Note: The number of accessible vehicles is limited; advance booking is strongly recommended.



This guide is designed to help you select the most suitable route based on your needs, providing detailed information on:

- Transport accessibility
- Assistance services available at stations
- Architectural barriers along the route
- Travel times and recommended solutions for passengers with disabilities

Whatever option you choose, the goal remains the same: to reach **St Peter's Basilica** comfortably, safely, and with ease—so you can begin your visit to Rome in the best possible way.



OPTION 1: FL3 REGIONAL TRAIN

From Roma Termini Station, take a **FL3 regional train toward Civitavecchia, Viterbo, or Cesano**, and get off at **Roma San Pietro Station**.

Roma Termini Station is equipped with elevators, lifting devices, moving walkways, accessible turnstiles, and LOGES tactile paving throughout. A tactile map is available at the entrance.

Movement between different station levels is facilitated by:

- Using the station stairlift with your wheelchair
- Using moving walkways, accessible turnstiles, and elevators

Note: Handrails are not available in some station corridors.

The regional train is equipped with a mobile boarding ramp and designated spaces for wheelchair users.

Roma San Pietro Station features LOGES tactile paving, tactile maps, ramps, and visual signage. Elevators are available to reach the platforms, and corridors are paved with smooth surfaces.

Note: Onboard announcements are audio-only. Handrails are not available in some corridors, and lifting devices are not present in the station.

From **Roma San Pietro Station**, take the exit onto **Via della Stazione di San Pietro**.

The station is fully accessible and equipped with elevators. The route to the Basilica is approximately **800 meters**, mostly level, with sidewalks featuring curb ramps. The path is equipped with LOGES tactile paving, as well as tactile and acoustic traffic signals at crossings.

- Accessible taxi services are also available outside the station.



OPTION 2: TAXI

Taxi services are clearly signposted outside the main station entrance on the **Via Marsala side**.

In this area, some vehicles are equipped for passengers with disabilities, featuring ramps and dedicated wheelchair space. Vehicles may include retractable ramps or swivel seats.

The area is level, equipped with LOGES tactile paving, and free from architectural barriers. Access to taxis is direct, with staff assistance available if required.

Fares are regulated by the Municipality of Rome and may be subject to change without prior notice. It is advisable to consult the official website romamobilita.it for updates.

Licensed taxis are easily identifiable: white vehicles with a "TAXI" sign on the roof and a visible license number displayed on the doors, rear, and inside the vehicle.

Note: Not all taxis are accessible. To ensure availability, it is recommended to book in advance and request a specially equipped vehicle.



Accessibility at St Peter's Basilica:

- An accessible entrance is located on the right-hand side of Bernini's colonnade, where a ramp leads directly to the Basilica entrance.
- The interior is free from significant architectural barriers.
- All five entrance doors, including the Holy Door, are equipped with ramps.
- The central nave and main chapels are fully accessible for wheelchair users.





Tickets and access

- **Entry to the Basilica is free of charge.** For the Dome and the Vatican Museums, tickets are required. Free admission is available for visitors with a disability of **74% or higher**, including one accompanying person.
- Visitors with disabilities and their companions benefit from priority access to the Basilica without the need for additional booking.
- Visitors must present documentation certifying eligibility for free entry.
