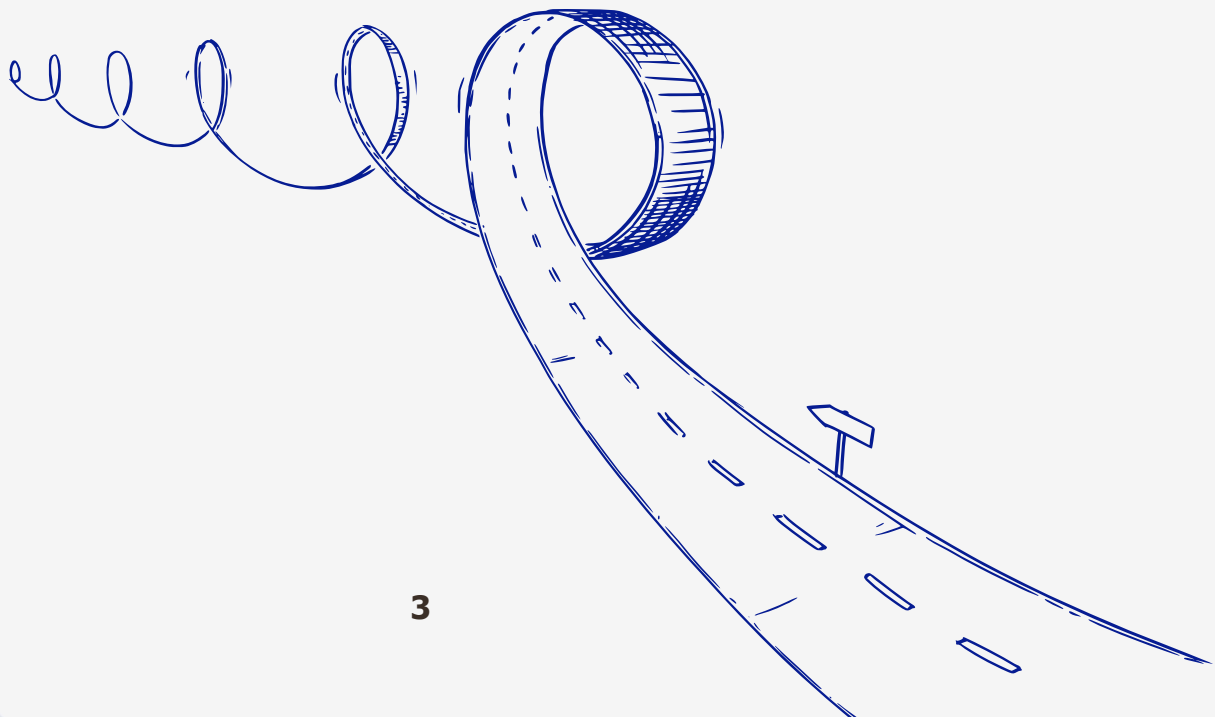

From Roma Tiburtina Railway Station...

... to the **COLOSSEUM** and the **ROMAN FORUM**


Reaching the archaeological heart of Rome from Roma Tiburtina railway station is the first step toward discovering one of the most extraordinary heritage sites in the world. This guide provides clear, practical, and up-to-date information on how to reach the Colosseum and the Roman Forum—located within one of the oldest archaeological parks in existence—in a way that is accessible, safe, and suitable for all visitors.

Several travel options are available, each offering different advantages in terms of travel time, comfort, and accessibility.



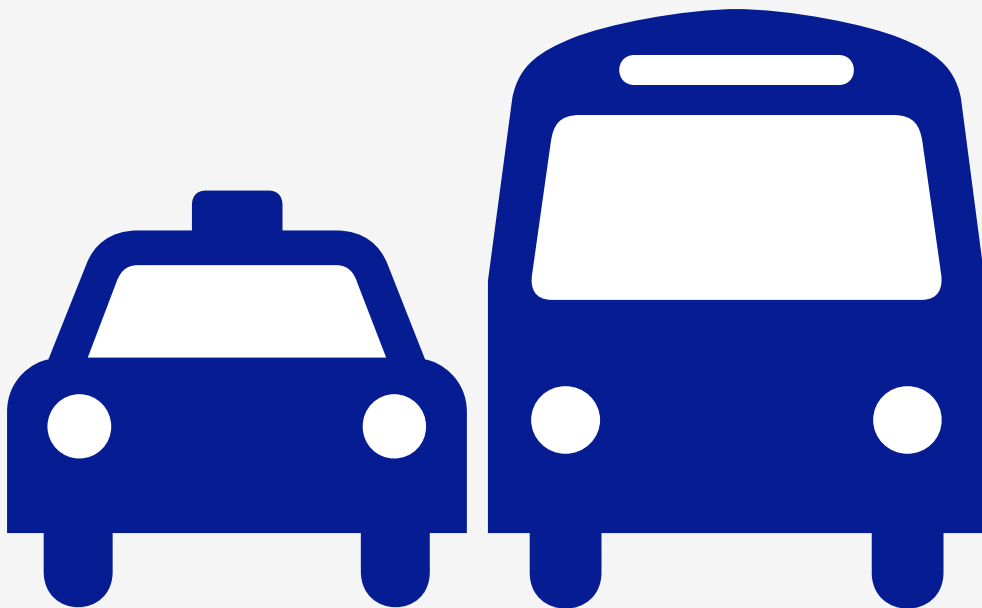


Option 1: From Roma Tiburtina, take **Metro Line B** toward “Laurentina” and get off at **Colosseo** station, which offers accessible routes.



Option 2: Choose a direct connection via private services, accessible taxis, or dedicated shuttle services—ideal for those who prefer, or require, minimal transfers.

Note: The number of accessible vehicles is limited; advance booking is strongly recommended.



Colosseo

This guide is designed to help you select the most suitable route based on your needs, providing detailed information on:

- Transport accessibility
- Assistance services available at stations
- Architectural barriers along the route
- Travel times and recommended solutions for passengers with disabilities

Whatever option you choose, the goal remains the same: to reach the **Colosseum** and the **Roman Forum** comfortably, safely, and with ease—so you can begin your visit to Rome in the best possible way.



OPTION 1: METRO LINE B

From Roma Tiburtina railway station, take **Metro Line B** toward **Laurentina** and get off at **Colosseo station**.

Roma Tiburtina station is equipped with elevators and escalators to reach platforms and different levels of the building. Audio and visual information systems are available, along with LOGES tactile paving and wayfinding indicators.

Colosseo station is **partially accessible**: main routes are equipped with stairlifts, handrails, and accessible turnstiles.

From the station ramp, you can proceed toward the Colosseum, which is located directly in front of the metro exit. The route is level, and sidewalks are equipped with curb ramps.

Access to the ticket office is located along **Via dei Verbiti**, where a small ramp is available.

Note: Elevators are not available, and LOGES tactile paving is only partially present.

To continue toward the entrance of the Roman Forum, proceed along the sidewalk of **Via dei Fori Imperiali** until the intersection with **Via in Miranda**.

The route is equipped with ramps and tactile signage.

The most accessible entrance is located at the intersection with **Largo della Salara Vecchia**, on the right-hand side of the gate.

The entrance is equipped with a descending ramp and an elevator.

OPTION 2: TAXI

Taxi services are available in the forecourt in front of the station (east side) outside the main entrance.

In this area, it is possible to request vehicles equipped for passengers with disabilities, featuring ramps and dedicated wheelchair space.

Fares are regulated by the Municipality of Rome and may be subject to change without prior notice. It is advisable to consult the official website romamobilita.it for updates.

Licensed taxis are easily identifiable: white vehicles with a "TAXI" sign on the roof and a visible license number displayed on the doors, rear, and inside the vehicle.

Note: Not all taxis are accessible. To ensure availability, it is recommended to book in advance and request a specially equipped vehicle.





Accessibility at the Colosseum:

- Visitors already in possession of a ticket may proceed to the left from Colosseo station
- The accessible entrance is the side entrance, adjacent to the group and underground access, equipped with a metal ramp and smoother paving compared to other entrances
- The Colosseum is served by elevators connecting all levels
- Assistance staff are available, and wheelchairs can be provided upon request

Note: Irregular surfaces and historical level differences are present throughout the monument.



Accessibility at the Roman Forum:

Accessible entrance:

- **Via della Salara Vecchia:** equipped with a ramp and an elevator providing access to the lower level of the Forum.



Tickets and access

- Free admission to the Colosseum and the Roman Forum is available for visitors with disabilities and one accompanying person, with **mandatory online booking**.
- Visitors must present documentation certifying eligibility for free entry.
